The Trump administration makes another disruptive shake-up in the intelligence community

The Trump administration is continuing its shake-up of the intelligence community with a potentially disruptive change of leadership at the National Counterterrorism Center, the agency that coordinates government efforts to guard the homeland.

The White House announced its plan to nominate as NCTC director Christopher Miller, a former Army Special Forces officer who had overseen counterterrorism efforts in the Trump White House before moving to a similar position at the Pentagon.

Miller gets solid marks from former colleagues, but the move has increased fears within the intelligence community that the administration has embarked on a politically motivated campaign against career professionals.

The move came hours after I reported that Richard Grenell, the acting director of national intelligence, had begun a "review" of the NCTC and was weighing staff cuts there and in other parts of

the Office of the Director of National Intelligence. Congress created both in 2003 as part of its effort to coordinate intelligence activities after the failure to "connect the dots" that allowed the terrorist attacks on Sept. 11, 2001.

Miller, if confirmed, would take over from Russell Travers, who has been acting director since the departure of Joseph Maguire last August to become acting DNI. Travers, a widely respected career intelligence officer, was told that he could remain as Miller's deputy, according to a Senate source who had been briefed by the ODNI leadership.

The timing of the proposed change was surprising, since it came as President Trump and most of the country were focused on the coronavirus threat that has preoccupied the world. But Grenell and the new team overseeing intelligence apparently couldn't wait. An intelligence source told me that Miller received a call about 10 p.m. Tuesday from the White House, asking if he would take the job. Travers didn't learn about the move until Wednesday morning, when he was briefed by an aide, the intelligence source said. Despite Travers's long record of service, Grenell apparently didn't notify him personally in advance that the White House had selected someone else for the top job. This treatment of a career officer will grate among his colleagues.

The move will add to concerns within the U.S. intelligence community, and among its partners abroad, that Trump is continuing a purge of what he views as disloyal subordinates at the ODNI, FBI and other spy agencies. This housecleaning began last July with the departure of DNI Daniel Coats; that was followed by the resignation in August of his deputy, Sue Gordon, after she was passed over for the top job. Then came the ouster last month of Maguire and his senior deputy, Andrew Hallman. "People in the intelligence community are very nervous because of the uncertainty," said the intelligence source. The political churn is especially upsetting because it comes at a time when there are so many serious global economic and public health issues that require attention. It's no time, in other words, for political vendettas.

Trump loyalists take command of the intelligence community

By David Ignatius Columnist At a moment when Americans have new appreciation for the government professionals who protect against global threats, the Trump administration is weighing cuts in funding and staff for the National Counterterrorism Center, created after Sept. 11, 2001, to shield the homeland from attack.

The debate about trimming the NCTC, as it is known, is part of a broader examination of intelligence coordination by Richard Grenell, a Trump loyalist who was named acting director of national intelligence last month. Grenell replaced Joseph Maguire, a 36-year Navy SEAL who had headed the NCTC before he became acting director of national intelligence last August.

A statement from the DNI's office said Grenell and his staff had begun a "careful review" of past studies that "have identified opportunities to refocus or transfer activities at ODNI to eliminate duplication of work with other agencies." While this review is underway, the statement said, Grenell has imposed a "short-term pause in external hiring" at the Office of the Director of National Intelligence and its components, such as the NCTC.

This "review" of intelligence-coordinating activities has created concern among intelligence professionals that a campaign is beginning against what President Trump and his loyalists view as a "deep state" in the national security community. Foreign intelligence partners share this worry about a Trump-led campaign to control intelligence.

Fear of a purge increased last July, when Daniel Coats was pushed out as director of national intelligence. His widely respected deputy, Sue Gordon, resigned in Augustafter she wasn't tapped to replace Coats. Then came the departures of Maguire and his chief deputy, Andrew Hallman, last month. All four had angered the White House, in part because they supported the intelligence community's findings that Russia has been meddling in U.S. politics to benefit Trump.

The debate about trimming the NCTC dates back two years, to a "summer study" launched by Coats. Officials say it has accelerated as a more political team has taken over intelligence policy. This group includes Michael Ellis, named this month to a National Security Council post overseeing intelligence, and Kashyap Patel, Grenell's senior adviser at ODNI. Both formerly worked for Devin Nunes (Calif.), the top Republican on the House Intelligence Committee and a passionate Trump supporter. The management issue is complicated. Some critics have long argued that the NCTC duplicates some functions of the CIA's Counterterrorism Center. Similar complaints have been made about the larger ODNI structure, which duplicates some of the legal, communications and management functions of the 17 agenciesit supervises.

The NCTC's biggest problem right now, officials say, is that it is understaffed. Of its roughly 1,000 employees, about 700 are full-time government workers and 300 are contractors. About 30 percent of the government workers are supposed to be loaned by the CIA and other agencies. But a significant number of these interagency transfer positions are vacant, an NCTC veteran said, weakening the cross-government mission. With Grenell's hiring freeze, and the reluctance of the CIA and other agencies to send transfers, the personnel shortage is becoming more severe.

The lack of adequate staff is felt especially at the NCTC's Directorate of Strategic Operational Planning, which coordinates counterterrorism policy across government agencies. This directorate was mandated by law when the NCTC was created in 2004 to "connect the dots" within government and avoid the catastrophic intelligence-sharing failure that allowed the terrorist attacks of 9/11.

Another key NCTC function that could be affected by the current squeeze is the modernization of its data collection. The current database, the Terrorist Identities Datamart Environment, or TIDE, collects names, passport numbers and other biographical information. The agency is building a broader registry that would include biometric and biographical data. But that work has slowed because of lack of resources, potentially leaving the nation vulnerable.

Russell Travers, a widely respected career intelligence officer, has been acting director of the NCTC since Maguire left to become acting DNI last year. Travers formerly served as chief data officer for both the NCTC and ODNI, and he's an expert in the data-management techniques that are part of the NCTC's core mission. A half-dozen intelligence veterans told me it is crucial that Travers remain in his job.

The stakes here are immense. The NCTC receives about 8,000 threat-related messages each day. Officials fear there aren't enough people now to input all that information efficiently or to modernize the system.

"This review is not an effort to purge," said the statement from Grenell's office about his plans. Members of Congress and the administration who care about the nation's security should make sure that promise is kept.

U.S. officials have told Sen. Bernie Sanders that Russia is attempting to help his presidential campaign as part of an effort to interfere with the Democratic contest, according to people familiar with the matter.

President Trump and lawmakers on Capitol Hill have also been informed about the Russian assistance to the Vermont senator, according to people familiar with the matter, who spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss sensitive intelligence.

It is not clear what form that Russian assistance has taken. U.S. prosecutors

"In 2016, Russia used internet propaganda to sow division in our country, and my understanding is that they are doing it again in 2020. Some of the ugly stuff on the internet attributed to our campaign may well not be coming from real supporters."

A spokesperson for the Sanders campaign declined to comment on the briefing by U.S. officials on Russia's attempts to help the Sanders campaign. .

Sanders's opponents have blamed some of his most vocal online supporters for injecting toxic rhetoric into the primaries. At a Democratic candidates debate in Las Vegas on Wednesday, Sanders indirectly blamed Russia, saying it was possible malign actors were trying to manipulate social media

to inflame divisions among Democrats.

"All of us remember 2016, and what we remember is efforts by Russians and others to try to interfere in our elections and divide us up," Sanders said. "I'm not saying that's happening, but it would not shock me."

Also this week, a senior U.S. intelligence official said that Russia had "developed a preference" for Trump in the 2020 campaign — an assessment that infuriated the president. Trump lambasted his acting intelligence director, Joseph Maguire, and DNI staff for sharing that information with lawmakers, believing that Democrats would use it to hurt Trump in the election.

Despite Trump's skepticism of Russian efforts to damage American democracy, officials in his administration have repeatedly warned that Russia has ongoing plans to interfere in U.S. elections and foster divisions among Americans, part of a strategic goal to undermine U.S. standing in the world. Some analysts believe that the Kremlin's goal is to cause the maximum disruption within the United States, and it throws the support of its hackers and trolls behind candidates based on that goal, not any particular affinity for the persons running.

After Sanders's remarks at the debate, some social media analysts were skeptical of the notion that Russians were already masquerading as the candidate's supporters.

"We have seen no evidence in open sources during this election cycle that an online community of Sanders supporters, known as Bernie bros, were catalyzed by what Sanders suggested could be 'Russian interference,'" said Graham Brookie, director of the Digital Forensic Research Lab at the Atlantic Council, which tracks disinformation on social media sites. "Any candidate or public official casually introducing the possibility of Russian influence without providing any evidence or context creates a specter of interference that makes responding to real interference harder."

It now appears, however, that Sanders may have had a reason to suspect Russia was again injecting itself into the U.S. electoral process, repeating some of what occurred in 2016.

In a February 2018 indictment of 13 Russian individuals and three companies that were alleged to have orchestrated the social media scheme, prosecutors alleged that the group "engaged in operations primarily intended to communicate derogatory information about Hillary Clinton, to denigrate other candidates such as Ted Cruz and Marco Rubio, and to support Bernie Sanders and then-candidate Donald Trump."

Prosecutors alleged that in February 2016, while Clinton and Sanders were locked in a bitter battle for the Democratic nomination, an internal memo was circulated at the St. Petersburg-based Internet Research Agency, which prosecutors said led the online effort, instructing their paid online trolls to "use any opportunity to criticize Hillary and the rest (except Sanders and Trump-we support them)."

The Internet Research Agency was bankrolled by a Russian oligarch close to President Vladimir Putin, according to U.S. officials.

Joseph Maguire, the former acting director of national intelligence, and his deputy, Andrew P. Hallman, resigned on Friday. Mr. Grenell told Mr. Hallman, popular in the office's Liberty Crossing headquarters, that his service was no longer needed, according to two officials. Mr. Hallman, who has worked

in the office or at the C.I.A. for three decades, expressed confidence in his colleagues in a statement but also referred to the "uncertainties that come with change."

The ouster of Mr. Hallman and exit of Mr. Maguire, who also oversaw the National Counterterrorism Center, allowed Mr. Grenell to install his own leadership team.

One of his first hires was Kashyap Patel , a senior National Security Council staff member and former key aide to Representative Devin Nunes, Republican of California and the former chairman of the House Intelligence Committee. Mr. Patel will have a mandate to "clean house," CBS News reported , citing a person close to the matter.

Dear Acting Director Grenell:

I write with several requests regarding your May 13, 2020, letter to Senators Charles E. Grassley and Ron Johnson in which you declassified the identities of executive branch officials who exercised their right, consistent with the law, to understand the identity of an individual in specific intelligence reports.

As you are well aware, there are substantial protections built into the process for requesting that identities of U.S. persons be unmasked in intelligence reports, ensuring that the rights of individual Americans are protected and that unmasking requests are granted only to those who need the information in order to protect U.S. national security. As you also know, there are thousands of such requests each year, each subject to the same process before it is approved. Nor, as you know, is this process unique to a single presidential administration. In fact, according to ODNI's annual transparency reports, between 2017 and 2018, the number of unmasked identities jumped from 9,529 in 2017 to 16,721 in 2018 under the Trump administration. In 2019, the total of unmasked identities reached 10,012.

I ask that you provide the Committee with the underlying intelligence reports in which the identity of the individual was "unmasked" to be Lt. Gen. Michael Flynn (ret.).

Additionally, I ask you to provide the rationale for declassifying these unmasking requests, given the potential compromise to sources and methods, and that this declassification occurred well short of the timeline required under Executive Order 13526. Just as Sec 1.7 of that Order prohibits over-classification for inappropriate reasons, selective declassification for political purposes undermines the integrity of our system for protecting classified information, undermines the Intelligence Community's credibility, and erodes public trust in institutions critical to protecting the nation.

Therefore, in order to more fully and properly inform the American people of the events surrounding the unmasking of Lt. Gen. Flynn (ret.), I further request that you declassify and make publicly available any intelligence report concerning conversations between Lt. Gen. Flynn (ret.) and Russian Ambassador to the United States, Sergey Kislyak. These calls have been the topic of the multiple investigations, trials, and plea agreements concerning General Flynn and merit being in the public domain, consistent with Executive Order, Sec 3.1(d).

Happy Friday and hope everyone is healthy and safe!

For context, the election community has three main thrusts at this time:

- 1. Our consistent interest in threats to infrastructure impacting voting activity and influence issues related to specific races, candidates, campaigns, relevant themes including plans & intentions.
- 2. Understanding the evolving landscape of the way forward on the remaining primaries, conventions and the general election in light of COVID restrictions and how adversaries can exploit vulnerabilities, potentially changing plans & intentions etc.
- 3. How, and what adversaries are continuing to push influence campaigns designed to undermine confidence in US institutions (including elections, functioning democracy etc.).

Although many of the staffs across the IC are working at lowest staffing, the community is maintaining a good reporting/production posture on threat actors as I'm sure you've seen over the past couple weeks.

Primaries Way Forward- CISA has produced two products (attached)- one gives the current laydown of postponed primaries and activities. The second, is a **very** detailed laydown of what it would take to move entirely to a Vote By Mail (VBM) model for the general election. I only include this to illustrate the enormous scale and effort it would take to make this move to entirely VBM. DHS assesses that there will have to be some level of in-person voting given these challenges in November.

• 2 June is the next "mini Super Tuesday" for many postponed primaries. DHS has asked that we look to increased staffing for that day. We will be discussing at our next Election Executive Sync on Wednesday (8 April), staffing opportunities to support this next milestone.

Congressional Deliverables- the draft ODNI response to the Nunes letter from the HPSCI is at the DMI FO for review (inclusive of legal and OLA inputs). Also, we have a rough draft of the HPSCI QFRs in-work and will engage with $OLA^{(b)(1)}_{(b)(3)}$ on their comments back on responses. No real deadline for either deliverable given the government posture. Also, the NSC is maintaining a spreadsheet of

the NDAA requirements related to election security. We are all in partnership with OLA.

Lastly, ODNI is not tracking any active petitions under the Notification Framework.

SEC. 6507. NOTIFICATION OF SIGNIFICANT FOREIGN CYBER INTRU-SIONS AND ACTIVE MEASURES CAMPAIGNS DIRECTED AT ELECTIONS FOR FEDERAL OFFICES.

(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) ACTIVE MEASURES CAMPAIGN.—The term "active measures campaign" means a foreign semi-covert or covert intelligence operation.

(2) CANDIDATE, ELECTION, AND POLITICAL PARTY.—The terms "candidate", "election", and "political party" have the meanings given those terms in section 301 of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 (52 U.S.C. 30101).

(3) CONGRESSIONAL LEADERSHIP.—The term "congressional leadership" includes the following:

(A) The majority leader of the Senate.

(B) The minority leader of the Senate.(C) The Speaker of the House of Representatives.

(D) The minority leader of the House of Representatives.

(4) CYBER INTRUSION.—The term "cyber intrusion" means an electronic occurrence that actually or imminently jeopardizes, without lawful authority, electronic election infrastructure, or the integrity, confidentiality, or availability of information within such infrastructure.

(5) ELECTRONIC ELECTION INFRASTRUCTURE.—The term "electronic election infrastructure" means an electronic information system of any of the following that is related to an election for Federal office:

(A) The Federal Government.

(B) A State or local government.

(C) A political party.

(D) The election campaign of a candidate.
(6) FEDERAL OFFICE.—The term "Federal office" has the meaning given that term in section 301 of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 (52 U.S.C. 30101). (7) HIGH CONFIDENCE.—The term "high confidence", with

respect to a determination, means that the determination is based on high-quality information from multiple sources.

(8) MODERATE CONFIDENCE.—The term "moderate confidence", with respect to a determination, means that a determination is credibly sourced and plausible but not of sufficient quality or corroborated sufficiently to warrant a higher level of confidence.

(9) OTHER APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES.—The term "other appropriate congressional committees" means-

(A) the Committee on Armed Services, the Committee on Foreign Relations, the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs, and the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate; and

(B) the Committee on Armed Services, the Committee on Foreign Affairs, the Committee on Homeland Security, and the Committee on Appropriations of the House of Representatives.

(b) DETERMINATIONS OF SIGNIFICANT FOREIGN CYBER INTRU-SIONS AND ACTIVE MEASURES CAMPAIGNS.—The Director of National Intelligence, the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the Secretary of Homeland Security shall jointly carry out

(c) BRIEFING.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 14 days after making a determination under subsection (b), the Director of National Intelligence, the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the Secretary of Homeland Security shall jointly provide a briefing to the congressional leadership, the congressional intelligence committees and, consistent with the protection of sources and methods, the other appropriate congressional committees. The briefing shall be classified and address, at a minimum, the following:

(A) A description of the significant foreign cyber intrusion or active measures campaign, as the case may be, covered by the determination.

(B) An identification of the foreign state or foreign nonstate person, group, or other entity, to which such intrusion or campaign has been attributed.

(C) The desirability and feasibility of the public release of information about the cyber intrusion or active measures campaign.

(D) Any other information such Directors and the Secretary jointly determine appropriate.

(2) ELECTRONIC ELECTION INFRASTRUCTURE BRIEFINGS.— With respect to a significant foreign cyber intrusion covered by a determination under subsection (b), the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Director of National Intelligence and the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, shall offer to the owner or operator of any electronic election infrastructure directly affected by such intrusion, a briefing on such intrusion, including steps that may be taken to mitigate such intrusion. Such briefing may be classified and made available only to individuals with appropriate security clearances.

(3) PROTECTION OF SOURCES AND METHODS.—This subsection shall be carried out in a manner that is consistent with the protection of sources and methods.

SEC. 6508. DESIGNATION OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OFFICER TO LEAD ELECTION SECURITY MATTERS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Director of National Intelligence shall designate a national counterintelligence officer within the National Counterintelligence and Security Center to lead, manage, and coordinate counterintelligence matters relating to election security.

(b) ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES.—The person designated under subsection (a) shall also lead, manage, and coordinate counterintelligence matters relating to risks posed by interference from foreign powers (as defined in section 101 of the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 (50 U.S.C. 1801)) to the following:

(1) The Federal Government election security supply chain.

(B) the Committee on Armed Services, the Committee on Foreign Affairs, the Committee on Homeland Security, and the Committee on Appropriations of the House of Representatives.

Sir-

As you know, tomorrow, six states will hold primaries tomorrow (Idaho, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, North Dakota and Washington). I've attached the DHS/CISA overview of the state systems as well as the characterization of the federal (CISA) relationship with them. These relationships and information sharing vary by state and can occasionally impact federal incident response.

The IC election teams will be working normal business hours tomorrow and on-call in the evening as polls close. We have a robust interagency phone tree backstopped with the resources of the IC Watch Offices to make sure we're supporting DHS and FBI.

On a related note, per a meeting with the National Guard, Virginia and Illinois have made formal requests to the Department of Defense for additional support in defending their infrastructure. US CYBERCOM will keep us posted on their formal response. At this juncture, I believe there may be a resource restraint in providing further National Guard federal (non-state) dollars to support these requests particularly out of concern that they could not support additional state interest.

We'll provide updates on all issues as tomorrow unfolds... Shelby

As the polls continue to close, BLUF, this was a relatively uneventful day for election infrastructure issues, meaning no events/activity that directly impacted voting activity and voting tallies overall. Of the relatively small activity reported today, **none** of it has been initially characterized as nefarious or foreign sponsored. Here are some additional notes for context & detail:


 California and Arkansas noted the most impactful issues with reports of problems with online voter lookup functions and access to voter registration databases. By the 6pm sync, CISA noted that these were attributed to issues with the applications/vendors and not characterized as a denial of service attack. For context, this type of issue would most likely impact voters seeking to know their voting/poll location.



- Unrelated to intel, but notable, impressive engagement by Tennessee to respond to overnight tornados with extended voting hours and sponsoring additional voting locations for displaced persons.

- There has been press reports of poll workers not reporting for duty due to the Covid-19 concerns. DHS shared that they have no reports from election officials of staffing problems at this time. DHS has directed any questions on topic back to state/local health officials. DHS hopes to host a follow-on engagement with HHS and CDC in the coming week or so with election officials to support any concerns in this area.
- The DHS press call at 11 was well attended and went over the allotted time. We expect
 Acting Secretary Wolf and Director Krebs to have a press conference between 230 and 330
 today. DHS shared that there has been a lot of questions about evidence of foreign
 interference. We have asked that if there are any prepared remarks or Q&A for the press

Would like to update you on the two issues we've been following: the activity against the HHS/CDC sites and the potential disinformation campaign. The community continues to look at both events to determine attribution and to see if the events may be linked, but have nothing conclusive yet.

HHS Office of National Security/Intelligence & Analysis Division today confirmed that this was an attack on the HHS network, not CDC or any other sub-agency of HHS. (b)(1), (b)(3) (b)(1), (b)(3)

The incident has been mitigated and is considered closed, however

(b)(1), (b)(3) CISA Integrated Operations Coordination Center indicated it may take as long as a week to sift through the network forensic logs related to the incident. We have not heard anything further from FBI. CTIIC's updated Event Report is attached.

Initial responses from the financial sector indicate that there have been many COVID-19related phishing emails, but no other targeting of the sector personnel. The FSARC found no reflections of disinformation being directed at the sector or its leadership. We still have not heard back from the broader FS-ISAC.

It is difficult to assess when we will know attribution of either activity, but CISA indicates that it will likely take a few days to determine the attribution of the spike in CDC network traffic. As far as the disinformation issue, we need to acquire additional information pertaining to the actual correspondences in order to be able to make some kind of assessment. The disinformation issue is particularly challenging as it falls between the cybersecurity community and the operational community. We are seeking to pull the threads in both areas. Our current outreach and the feedback we've gotten so in regards to the disinformation issue is included below.

A quick update on the way ahead for both the DDS on the CDC website and the disinformation attack on the markets.

Attached is a CTIIC report on the spike in activity affecting the CDC networks. (b)(1), (b)(3) (b)(1), (b)(3)

In contrast to the low sophistication level of the DDS, the disinformation campaign is a sophisticated, multi-sector effort and is most likely being done by either a national state or sophisticated cyber criminal organization. We are working across the community, there will be a VTC at 1530, to have Departments and Agencies reach out to private sector entities they currently have under contract to see if they can glean additional information about the following:

• Regarding false rumors about the Stafford Act being invoked for a national quarantine, and related market-panicking disinformation, where is this information trending on social media, and does it appear to originate from foreign sources?

• Have we observed any link by foreign cyber and/or influence programs to the activity in question? This would include either originating the information, or attempting to amplify it, or common use of infrastructure, or links to previous campaigns assessed to have a foreign nexus.

• Do we have any reporting for key US adversaries alleging recent planning for economic warfare and/or other efforts to hurt the US economy?

• Have key foreign adversaries' cyber/influence actors previously used targeted text messing to the US population, or to other target populations?

• How are these disinformation messages spreading on Reddit and other user-driven sharing sites? Do any of these accounts have foreign links? What other topics do the message originators, if foreign, attempt to influence?

We are also reaching out, via Department of Treasury, to the Financial Systemic Analysis and Resilience Center (FSARC) to share our thoughts and see what their perspective is.

I've been in touch with Iranga Kahangama from NSC Cyber and this is tracking with their thoughts as well.

We will share any feedback and insights when we get them and will continue to press forward.

DHS hopes to host a follow-on engagement with HHS and CDC in the coming week or so with election officials to support any concerns in this area.
- The DHS press call at 11 was well attended and went over the allotted time. We expect Acting Secretary Wolf and Director Krebs to have a press conference between 230 and 330 today. DHS shared that there has been a lot of questions about evidence of foreign interference. We have asked that if there are any prepared remarks or Q&A for the press conference that we are standing by to coordinate on any characterizations that touch IC equities.

Our next sessions are at 1500, 1800, 2100- I'll send a summary after our last session pending anything materially changing during the day that we'll flag.

Chairman Schiff:

On 28 September 2018, the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI), in unanimous and bipartisan fashion, voted to publicly-release 53 transcripts of witness interviews that your committee conducted during its investigation into foreign interference in the 2016 presidential election. In advance of this public release, in November 2018, your Committee transmitted the 53 transcripts, totaling over 6,000 pages, to the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) for the purpose of an interagency classification review to prevent the inadvertent disclosure of classified information.

The ODNI-supervised interagency review of 43 (of the original 53) transcripts was completed in June 2019. As of today, the interagency review of the remaining ten transcripts has been completed, as well. Additionally, in your letter of 26 March 2019, you also requested the ODNI, "under no circumstances...share HPSCI transcripts with the White House, President Trump, or any persons associated with the White House or President." Pursuant to your guidance, these transcripts have not been shared with the White House.

All of the transcripts, with our required redactions, can be released to the public without any concerns of disclosing classified material. In the interests of transparency and accountability, I urge you to honor your previous public statements, and your Committee's unanimous vote on this matter, to release all 53 cleared transcripts to all Members of Congress and the American public as soon as possible. I am also willing to release the transcripts directly from the ODNI, as to ensure we comply with the unanimous and bipartisan vote to release the transcripts.

Additionally, my reporting has been published in The Guardian, The Wall Street Journal, The Financial Times, Salon, CBS Marketwatch, The Los Angeles Times, The Nation, Truthout, Al Jazeera English and Al Jazeera America.

I request a complete waiver of all search and duplication fees. If my request for a waiver is denied, I request that I be considered a member of the news media for fee purposes.

Under 5 U.S.C. §552(a)(4)(A)(iii), "Documents shall be furnished without any charge ... if disclosure of the information is in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester." Disclosure in this case meets the statutory criteria, as the records sought to detail the operations and activities of government. Andrew McCarthy: Flynn unmasking standoff – Who 'owns' classified info? Who gets to make it public?

Fox News is <u>reporting</u> that there may be some tension between Justice Department officials and Richard Grenell, the acting Director of National Intelligence, regarding the declassification of information related to "unmasking" – i.e., the revelation of the identity of Americans incidentally intercepted during our spy agencies' collection of foreign intelligence.

I suspect that there may be less friction here than confusion, probably on ODNI's part, and probably about <u>Justice Department</u> rules and procedures.

In the government, classified information "belongs" to the <u>executive branch</u>, whose intelligence agencies collect and analyze it. That is why the president is the ultimate authority, having the power to declassify any such information.

Beneath the president, intelligence officials may review specific classified information if they have a "need to know" and sufficiently high-level security clearances. But the information "belongs" to the intelligence agency that collected or created it.

A concrete example. If an FBI agent had a security clearance high enough to authorize access to a file of topsecret intelligence collected by the CIA, that agent would be permitted to see that information. But neither that agent nor the FBI would be authorized to declassify it so it could be shared more widely. Only the CIA could do that. In terms of equity, it would be the CIA's information.

To grasp what's going on with the unmasking issue, we also need to distinguish the declassification of information from the publication of that information.

The vast majority of information held by the government is not classified. Yet, most of it is also non-public. The government has the power to compel people to produce various categories of information, and it may store and analyze that data. There is a trade-off, though: To protect people's privacy (among other reasons), the government may not disseminate information publicly in the absence of a lawful reason.

In particular, the Justice Department does not disclose information just to disclose it, or just because the public might find it fascinating. DOJ must have a legal reason for publicizing previously non-public information.

We saw that last week, when DOJ moved to dismiss the case against Michael Flynn. Appended to the motion were exhibits that included non-public FBI reports, some portions of which may have been classified at some point. That information had been kept under wraps for years. But until the Justice Department filed a legal submission in a public court proceeding, to which these documents were relevant, no classified portions were declassified, and none of the information was made public.

Classified and other sensitive information relevant to the Trump-Russia investigation is of immense public importance. President Trump has said that he'd like to see the information made public. This has been frustrating for those of us closely watching the story because the president has the power to declassify and publicize. Yet, he obviously does not want to be accused of harming national security. (By definition, information is classified because it's publication would harm national security.) Nor does he want to be accused of compromising investigations, which can be undermined if information that is sensitive is prematurely publicized.

On the other hand, history and common sense teach us that the intelligence agencies' authority to stamp information "classified" creates great temptation to exploit that authority to hide information that could be embarrassing or even incriminating. They chide us that insisting on disclosure somehow imperils national security or endangers intelligence sources.

Clearly, Grenell's job at ODNI includes breaking this disclosure barrier. The president is frustrated by the resistance he has gotten from intelligence agencies, who never want to disclose anything. Grenell, an ardent Trump supporter who had been serving as U.S. ambassador to Germany, has been sent to ODNI, in part, to ensure that information related to the Trump-Russia investigation is disclosed unless there is a truly compelling reason to keep it concealed.

The unmasking controversy is of great public interest. Obama officials unmasked an unusually large number of Americans, reportedly including many connected to Donald Trump. Several Obama officials were apparently involved. We should know which officials. We should know why they included some, such as U.N. Ambassador Samantha Power, who had little or no need to know the identities of Americans intercepted in foreign intelligence collection. On paper at least, Power was responsible for hundreds of unmaskings.

Grenell has reportedly declassified this information, which he was apparently empowered to do because ODNI has equity over it. Now, he wants it publicized. He realizes it is relevant to DOJ's investigation into the genesis of the Obama administration's Trump-Russia probe. Grenell thus seems to have figured that transmitting this now-declassified information to DOJ was the best way to get it released publicly.

Again, however, the Justice Department must have a lawful purpose to publish information. DOJ is still investigating, and investigators virtually never want evidence to become public until their investigation is concluded. DOJ is no doubt very interested in the information Grenell has provided; but it has no immediate legal need or strategic desire for public disclosure.

That said, the usual rules apply. Therefore, if the classified information belongs to ODNI, then ODNI has the power to declassify it. And if ODNI has declassified the unmasking information, and believes it has a legitimate

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reason to disclose that information publicly, it may do so ... though Grenell will have to brace himself for the uproar from critics who will claim ODNI has acted politically, and potentially to the detriment of national security.


If the Justice Department's investigation is to be regarded as good-faith law-enforcement rather than politics, then DOJ cannot be perceived as declassifying and publicizing information for political purposes. From DOJ's perspective, the unmasking information need not be disclosed unless and until there is a legitimate law-enforcement reason for doing so.

By contrast, if the unmasking information belongs to ODNI, then DNI Grenell has the authority to declassify it, and perhaps to disclose it. But he would have to be able to explain why doing so was an appropriate exercise of discretion in the public interest, rather than an abuse of power for political advantage.



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Folks,

In response to queries from media and others today about whether security clearance holders and applicants could suffer adverse consequence (such as having clearances denied, etc) due to financial problems (such as loan defaults, bankruptcies, etc) suffered as a result of COVID-19.... we issued a statement today clarifying that clearance holders and applicants would not suffer such consequences

In short, we noted that existing SEAD 4 policies ensure that security clearance applicants and holders will not be unduly penalized in the security clearance process for financial hardships over which they have no control. Existing policy provides for mitigation of potential economic difficulties impacting clearance holders and applicants.

Senator Warner had written a letter to OPM and ODNI about this last week I believe. Our folks had also received some queries from INSA and others. I heard today from ClearanceJobs and some other media outlets who cover security clearance reform.

Exclusive: Adam Schiff blocking release of key Russia investigation witness transcripts, officials say

The House Intelligence Committee voted <u>unanimously</u> in the fall of 2018 to release dozens of witness interview transcripts from its investigation into Russian interference, but the transcripts have not been made public.

The declassification process by the Office of the Director of National Intelligence was expected to take just a few weeks or months, but nearly two years later, some administration officials, as well as ranking Republican member Devin Nunes, are blaming Chairman Adam Schiff for the delay.

"Adam Schiff is thwarting the will of the House Intelligence Committee as expressed in the bipartisan vote in September 2018 to make these transcripts public," one senior intelligence official told the *Washington Examiner*. "He has appointed himself arbiter of what the public should see and has refused to allow the White House to review its own equities, making declassification of 10 of the transcripts impossible. It's difficult to imagine any motive other than Schiff is still trying to control the narrative on Russia collusion."

Forty-three of the 53 transcripts have gone through the declassification process and were returned to Schiff over half a year ago, but he has not released them, despite promising last fall to make them public quickly. *Just The News* reported on aspects of this controversy earlier this week.

A sticking point with the remaining 10 transcripts is the desire by the Office of the Director of National Intelligence to allow the White House to review them as part of the declassification process.

In March 2019, under then-Director of National Intelligence Dan Coats, ODNI staffers briefed the House Intelligence Committee that some of the interviews implicated "White House equities" and that the top spy office "looked for mention of interactions or communications with current or former [White House] and [National Security Council] officials either during transition or after descriptions of policies or direction established within the [White House] and [NSC]" as part of the declassification process, according to a letter

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Schiff sent to the ODNI obtained by the *Washington Examiner*. The ODNI said some of the witness testimony "could be privileged" and that a determination like that "can only be made by" the White House.

Schiff rejected the request from Coats a week later.

"Under no circumstances shall ODNI, or any other element of the Intelligence Community, share any HPSCI transcripts with the White House, President Trump, or any persons associated with the White House or the President," Schiff wrote. "Such transcripts remain the sole property of HPSCI, and were transmitted to ODNI for the limited purpose of enabling a classification review by IC elements and the Department of Justice."

Coats left the ODNI in August 2019. He was succeeded by Joseph Maguire, who, after the Ukraine impeachment controversy, was <u>replaced</u> by Richard Grenell, the U.S. ambassador to Germany.

The *Washington Examiner* has learned that at least two of the 10 disputed transcripts do not contain classified information and that Schiff could release them, along with the 43 other declassified transcripts.

Nunes told the *Washington Examiner* that Schiff should make the already declassified transcripts public immediately.

"HPSCI Democrats opposed every Republican document request and subpoena that helped to expose malfeasance in the FBI's Russia collusion probe. And now, by refusing to publish the witness transcripts or the transcript of the committee's briefing with former [intelligence community Inspector General] Michael Atkinson, the Democrats are blatantly continuing to hide documents that expose their own mistruths," Nunes said. "There is no reason for keeping these documents secret except that they want to hide what's in them."

In January, an official from Schiff's committee staff <u>claimed</u> to the *Washington Times* that Atkinson's testimony about his controversial handling of the <u>Ukraine whistleblower complaint</u> was not conducted in conjunction with the Foreign Affairs Committee and the Oversight Committee, the two other House panels helping lead the impeachment effort, and so, it did not technically count as a deposition. The unnamed official argued that "contrary to what has been said, the chairman does not have the ability unilaterally to classify or declassify [an Intelligence Committee] transcript."

Schiff's office did not respond to the *Washington Examiner's* multiple requests for comment about Atkinson's closed-door testimony transcript, nor about why the 53 Russia investigation witness transcripts have not been released.

The 10 transcripts that Schiff blocked the White House from viewing and therefore stalled the declassification process on are interviews of Trump son-in-law and White House senior adviser Jared Kushner, former <u>chief</u> <u>executive</u> for the Trump campaign Steve Bannon, former Obama <u>deputy national security adviser</u> Ben Rhodes, former <u>Attorney General</u> Loretta Lynch, former <u>Deputy Attorney General</u> Sally Yates, former <u>U.S. Ambassador</u> to the United Nations Samantha Power, former Obama <u>national security adviser</u> Susan Rice, former Trump campaign manager Corey Lewandowski, former White House deputy assistant Keith Schiller, and Mary McCord, a former assistant attorney general for national security who was <u>involved</u> in the FBI's Russia investigation.

Among the 43 other witness interviews included testimony by former <u>Director of National Intelligence</u> James Clapper, Donald Trump Jr., White House adviser Hope Hicks, longtime Trump friend and <u>recently convicted</u> "fixer" Roger Stone, former Clinton campaign chairman John Podesta, and former FBI <u>Deputy Director</u> Andrew McCabe. Perkins Coie lawyers Michael Sussman, a former DOJ lawyer who <u>passed along</u> alleged details about Russian interference to former FBI general counsel James Baker, and Marc Elias, the chairman who was the Clinton campaign's general counsel and <u>hired Fusion GPS</u> on behalf of the campaign, were also among them. One senior Trump administration official familiar with the declassification process told the *Washington Examiner*, "There is no excuse for Adam Schiff personally controlling the release of information that the Intelligence Committee voted 19 months ago to release and that the intelligence community has declassified." The official said of Schiff: "If he was interested in transparency, as he has claimed, he would make all of these transcripts public."

Republicans on the House Intelligence Committee said they never expected it to take this long for the Russia investigation witness transcripts to be made public. In mid-September of 2018, then-Chairman Nunes told Fox News he hoped that, in the interest of "full transparency," the transcripts would be released "in the next few weeks" and hopefully "before the election."

In late September 2019, Schiff suggested to the House Intelligence Committee that he intended to release dozens of the transcripts.

"They have been released, yes. They have been returned to us with either redactions or with the attestation that there is nothing classified in them. There are, I think, a couple others that they have not returned to us, but they have said are unclassified, and since we possess them, it is our intention to release those as well," Schiff <u>said</u>. Of the 10 transcripts in dispute, he added, "But all we are asking the ODNI is to tell us what is classified. So, we will be releasing them as expeditiously as we can when we get the redactions back."

Schiff accused the White House of "hijacking" the process in an <u>interview</u> with *Politico* at the time, claiming that the 10 transcripts that the ODNI wanted the White House to be able to review, including two without classified information, had been held "hostage." The report said that the "ODNI has returned 43 of the 53 transcripts to the committee with classified information redacted" and that "Schiff still intends to release the bulk of the Russia transcripts in the near future."

This is not the first clash between Schiff and Nunes on the House Intelligence Committee. When Nunes led the committee in March 2018, it released a report on Russian interference concluding that Russia had interfered in the election but found <u>no evidence</u> of collusion. Schiff and the Democrats released their <u>own report</u>, arguing that Trump-Russia collusion was likely. In a brush over the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act, Nunes argued government surveillance powers were abused to target the Trump campaign, while Schiff defended the FBI's actions.

Special counsel Robert Mueller's 448-page <u>report</u>, released in April 2019, found the Russians had interfered in the 2016 election in a "sweeping and systematic fashion" but "did not establish" any criminal conspiracy between the Trump campaign and Russia.

DOJ Inspector General Michael Horowitz's lengthy December report <u>criticized</u> the Justice Department and the FBI for 17 "significant errors and omissions" <u>related</u> to the FISA warrants against Trump campaign associate Carter Page and for the bureau's reliance on British ex-spy Christopher Steele's <u>unverified</u> dossier. Steele put his research together at the behest of Glenn Simpson's <u>opposition research firm Fusion GPS</u>, funded by Hillary Clinton's presidential campaign and the Democratic National Committee through the Perkins Coie law firm.

U.S. Attorney John Durham, who was selected by Attorney General William Barr, recently <u>expanded</u> his investigative team as he looks into the origins of the Trump-Russia investigation and reviews the actions taken by law enforcement figures and the intelligence community.

Recently <u>declassified footnotes</u> from the Horowitz report indicate the FBI was aware that a Russian disinformation campaign may have affected Steele's dossier.

Grenell rejects Schiff's bid to control national intelligence

Acting-Director of National Intelligence <u>Richard Grenell</u> has dinged Rep. Adam Schiff in a new letter, expressing surprise the Trump foe didn't praise the appointment of two women to head counter-terrorism unit and rejecting the congressman's belief that lawmakers control the DNI's day-to-day management decisions.

Mr. Schiff, California Democrat and chairman of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, had written to Mr. <u>Grenell</u> on April 7 questioning his legal authority to reorganize the Office of National Intelligence and its <u>National Counter Terrorism Center</u>.

In an April 20 reply obtained by The Washington Times, Mr. <u>Grenell</u> called Mr. Schiff's ideas "suggestions."

The exchange of letters promises to be a running battle between the congressman who led the campaign to impeach and remove President Trump and the person Mr. Trump picked in February to direct national intelligence, including the CIA.

"I must disagree with your proposals to divest the DNI of managerial competence and personnel decision-making authority, and to replace your committee's mandate for Intelligence Community (IC) oversight with a mandate for IC administration," Mr. <u>Grenell</u> wrote, staking out his claim to power.

Mr. <u>Grenell</u> also rebutted Mr. Schiff's allegation that a secret intelligence briefing on Russia in March was cooked.

"I must also speak on behalf of the career intelligence officers at ODNI, whom your letter accuses of politicizing the briefing to Members of Congress of March 10th," Mr. <u>Grenell</u> said. "As the Acting DNI, I am compelled to defend these career officers from unsubstantiated indictments of their motivations and judgment. Many are offended by the accusations that they did not share unvarnished assessments. If you share with me the reports you believe provide

evidence for these claims, I can promise you that I will review them with the seriousness such accusations demand."

And Mr. <u>Grenell</u> took issue with Mr. Schiff's criticism of the change in counter-terrorism leadership.

"I must begin by voicing my surprise that your four-page letter said nothing about the historic appointment of the first female Director of the National Counterterrorism Center (<u>NCTC</u>)," Mr. <u>Grenell</u> said. "Instead, you expressed concerns regarding the retirement of the former male Director. You erroneously cast judgement on the reason of his departure while ignoring the accomplishments of <u>NCTC</u>'s new leadership, two highly qualified female officers serving as the Acting Director and Acting Deputy Director. Diversity of the IC workforce should always be celebrated, and I am proud that we increased diversity within the ODNI's senior ranks, to include more women and members of the LGBT community."

Mr. <u>Grenell</u> is in the process of downsizing headquarters and the <u>NCTC</u> to free up more positions for operational agencies in the field and posts abroad.

White House Pushes to Recover Americans Held Overseas The president's interest in the case of Austin Tice, a journalist who went missing in Syria in 2012, prompted the C.I.A. to renew its focus on finding him. By Adam Goldman and Julian E. Barnes March 13, 2020

WASHINGTON — Last year, administration officials briefed President Trump on a hostage whose case he has taken an interest in: Austin Tice, a former Marine missing in Syria. The C.I.A. pledged to ramp up efforts to learn where he is being held and why Syria refuses to negotiate his release.

The C.I.A.'s renewed focus on Mr. Tice, who was working as a journalist when he was captured in 2012, reflects a broader push by the Trump administration to focus more intently on Americans being held hostage abroad.

The administration has helped free Americans held in Egypt, Iran, Turkey and Afghanistan and is trying to win Mr. Tice's freedom as well as working to find Mark R. Frerichs, a former Navy diver kidnapped last month in Afghanistan. The White House wants him freed before American troops leave the country in a peace deal with the Taliban, an urgent deadline for the Pentagon and intelligence agencies to locate Mr. Frerichs.

Returning American hostages is Mr. Trump's "top priority," Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said this week in a statement marking the 13th anniversary of the disappearance inside Iran of Robert A. Levinson, a former F.B.I. agent and C.I.A. contractor.

For the American military, the C.I.A. and other intelligence agencies, focusing more on hostages is a way to show an often mercurial commander in chief that the government is responding to the priorities he has set. The appointment of the former top envoy for hostage negotiations, Robert C. O'Brien, as national security adviser has also elevated the issue, and the National Counterterrorism Center is leading a review of hostage recovery efforts.

Mr. Trump's interest in seeing American hostages brought home is a reflection of his us-versus-them worldview that often puts foreign policy issues in stark terms, a senior administration official said, adding that the president takes it personally when adversaries illegally detain Americans.

Mr. Trump invited to the State of the Union the parents of Kayla Mueller, who was taken captive in August 2013 before being killed by the Islamic State in early 2015. The military mission last year to kill the group's leader, Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, was named after Ms. Mueller's birthday.

"America's warriors never forgot Kayla - and neither will we," Mr. Trump said during the address last month.

Before the speech, Ms. Mueller's parents were given a tour of the White House and met briefly with Mr. Trump and Vice President Mike Pence. They also spoke with both Mr. O'Brien and Kashyap Patel, then a senior counterterrorism official who was handling hostage issues.

The killings of Ms. Mueller and of the journalist James Foley in 2014, another American in Syria, helped prompt President Barack Obama to make wholesale changes in how the government dealt with hostages and their families. The Obama administration established a Hostage Recovery Fusion Cell and created a special presidential envoy for hostage affairs, the post Mr. O'Brien held.

The Trump administration's look at hostage operations is part of a five-year review of the Obama directive.

While he was the hostage czar, Mr. O'Brien pushed hard to figure out a way to free Mr. Tice. He cited the case to Ms. Mueller's parents when they visited the White House as one of several the administration was trying to resolve.

Based on a mosaic of intelligence, officials believe Mr. Tice, now 38, remains alive and is being held by the Syrian government, according to former and current officials. Questions remain about why the Syrian government has neither admitted to holding him in the nearly eight years since he was abducted nor negotiated his release, and why it has released other Americans who were captured after him.

The Trump administration has pushed unsuccessfully to win Mr. Tice's release. Early in his 15-month tenure as C.I.A. director, Mike Pompeo tried to set up back-channel talks with Ali Mamlouk, Syria's powerful intelligence chief who is close with President Bashar al-Assad. The effort fizzled but also prompted concerns among some administration officials that the C.I.A.'s outreach might have left the mistaken impression with the Syrians that Mr. Tice was a spy.

In August 2018, the C.I.A. dispatched another top senior agency official with expertise in the Middle East to meet with Mr. Mamlouk in Damascus, former American officials said. During the meeting, the C.I.A. official brought up Mr. Tice, the former officials said. What came of the meeting is not clear.

The administration has also tried without success to engage both the United Arab Emirates and the Vatican to assist with the Tice case. The Emiratis, who played a key role in 2019 in freeing Danny Burch, an American oil worker who had been held hostage in Yemen, reopened its embassy in Damascus in 2018.

As the hostage czar, Mr. O'Brien embraced the idea of traveling to Damascus to negotiate with the Syrian government. Mr. Pompeo, now the secretary of state, nixed the proposal for security reasons, though some administration officials were skeptical that Mr. O'Brien's life would have been in danger. Other administration officials viewed such a trip as a mistake because a visit by a high-ranking American official could bolster the Assad government while probably doing little to prompt it to release Mr. Tice.

Mr. Tice's family has sought to keep public attention on his case to pressure the government to continue working for his release. Debra Tice, Mr. Tice's mother, has held news conferences and granted interviews in which she praised Mr. Trump's focus on the case of her son and other hostages.

She recently told the Fox News host Tucker Carlson that the Syrian government had invited an American official to talk about her son's case but accused "neocons at the State Department" of intervening to stop the trip. It was unclear whether she was referring to Mr. Pompeo. Ms. Tice declined through a spokesman to comment.

Critics have accused the Trump administration of missing opportunities to win Mr. Tice's release. It has made concessions to the Assad government without demanding Mr. Tice's release or anything else in return, including when administration officials announced in 2017 that they would no longer pursue Mr. Assad's ouster, and again last year when Mr. Trump abruptly pulled back American forces fighting the Islamic State, essentially giving up much of the land in Syria that the military had seized from the group back to Mr. Assad's government.

Mr. Frerichs's case is similarly caught up in delicate geopolitical negotiations. As the military begins to withdraw its personnel from Afghanistan as part of a deal with the Taliban, the White House has stepped up its pressure on the Defense Department to get home hostages still held there, according to a senior official.

Mr. Frerichs, the former Navy diver who was working as a contractor in Afghanistan, was captured in February, and officials believe he is being held by the Haqqani militant network in Afghanistan. Some officials expressed concern that if Mr. Frerichs is not found quickly, he could be smuggled into Pakistan, making a rescue by American commandos more difficult because of the political sensitivities and potentially treacherous terrain.

This letter is an interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated 27 April 2021, in which you requested the following:

- 1. All emails, text messages, including attachments, sent and received by former Principal Deputy to the Acting Director of National Intelligence Kash Patel.
- 2. All memos, reports, briefing materials sent to and prepared for Kash Patel.

Your request is being processed in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. This response addresses the processing of 24 documents responsive to item number one of your aforementioned request (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000410 – 000543). Upon review, we have determined that one (1) of those documents may be released to you in full (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000418 – 000419). Additionally, 19 of those documents are being released to you in part (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000410 – 000413, 000416 – 000431, 000436, 000531 – 000534, and 000538 – 000543) pursuant to the following FOIA exemptions:

- (b)(3), which applies to information exempt from disclosure by statute, and, in this case, specifically the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, statute 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m), which protects identifying information of ODNI personnel;
- (b)(5), which applies to information that concerns communications within or between agencies that are protected by legal privileges; and
- (b)(6), which applies to information, the release of which would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

The remaining four (4) documents are being withheld in full (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000414 – 000415, 000432 – 000435, 000437 – 000530, and 000535 – 000537), pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(5) and (b)(6).

In addition to the above documents, the ODNI has processed an additional 175 pages concerning item number one of your request. Those pages were identified as responsive and sent out for consultation with other government agencies this month.

Finally, the National Security Council withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(5) and (b)(6).



Dear Acting Director Grenell:

Recent media reporting has discussed the existence of Presidential Emergency Action Documents (PEADs), described as classified documents created by the Executive Branch that include draft proclamations, executive orders, and proposals for legislation to be deployed during an emergency. As reported, no PEADs appear to have ever been invoked, but past documents have purportedly contemplated the suspension of habeas corpus, the detention of U.S. citizens without requisite suspicion of criminal activity, the execution of warrantless searches and seizures, and the imposition of martial law, all of which would raise significant constitutional concerns if implemented.

The President has declared an emergency in light of the coronavirus. In addition, Title 50, U.S. Code, Section 3312 requires that the Director of National Intelligence submit to the congressional intelligence committees any "covered policy document," which is defined to include any presidential directive or other document that "assigns tasks, roles, or responsibilities to the intelligence community or an element of the intelligence community." However, the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence has not been advised of the existence or substance of any current PEADs, including any PEADs that relate to the Intelligence Community or require classification due to urgent national security concerns.

In our democratic system, emergency powers not expressly enumerated in the Constitution are only available to a president pursuant to statutory authorization by Congress, and these authorities and their exercise are subject to scrutiny by the Courts. If these emergency powers are being contemplated, they should be transparent and made available for Congressional oversight. Accordingly, we request that, at the soonest possible date, you or a designated senior staff member produce to and brief the Committee on the existence and substance of any such PEADs, or, if none exist, that you so state, in accordance with your obligation to keep the Committee fully informed.

Thank you for your attention to this request. We look forward to scheduling this briefing at the soonest possible date.

This letter is an interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated 27 April 2021, in which you requested the following:

- 2. All memos, reports, briefing materials sent to and prepared for Kash Patel.

Your request was being processed in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. This response addresses the processing of fifty-seven (57) documents responsive to item number one of your aforementioned request. - (b)(3), which applies to information exempt from disclosure by statute, and, in this case, specifically the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, statue 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m), which protects identifying information of ODNI personnel;
- (b)(5), which applies to information that concerns communications within or between agencies that are protected by legal privileges; and
- (b)(6), which applies to information, the release of which would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

Dear Ambassador Grenell:

On January 28, 2020, we sent a classified letter to Attorney General Barr requesting that he declassify four footnotes that we identified after reviewing the Justice Department Inspector General's classified report on the Crossfire Hurricane investigation.¹ In the unclassified cover letter, which we have attached hereto, we explained that this classified information provides insight essential for an accurate evaluation of the entire investigation, and the public interest in the disclosure of the information outweighs the need to protect it.

Since sending that letter, we have had very fruitful discussions with the Justice Department. We very much appreciate Attorney General Barr's focus on transparency and his understanding that this important information ought to be public. However, there are several sections of the footnotes that certain members of the Intelligence Community are concerned about declassifying. Accordingly, we are forwarding you our classified letter to Attorney General Barr, and we request that you ensure that all the footnotes are declassified to the fullest extent possible so that the American people have a full understanding of what transpired during the Crossfire Hurricane investigation.

Dear Attorney General Barr:

(U) The Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs and the Committee on Finance are continuing oversight of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and its Crossfire Hurricane investigation. We have reviewed the classified report of the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) with regard to the FBI's Crossfire Hurricane investigation, and we are deeply concerned about certain information that remains classified.¹ Specifically, we are concerned that certain sections of the public version of the report are misleading because they are contradicted by relevant and probative classified information redacted in four footnotes. This classified information is significant not only because it contradicts key statements in a section of the report, but also because it provides insight essential for an accurate evaluation of the entire investigation. The American people have a right to know what is contained within these four footnotes and, without that knowledge, they will not have a full picture as to what happened during the Crossfire Hurricane investigation. Congress and the Executive Branch should not be the only custodians of this information and the public interest in the disclosure of the information outweighs the need to protect it.

(U) Consequently, we are writing to respectfully request that you, pursuant to the declassification authority delegated to you by the President over matters related to this investigation, fully declassify the four footnotes to ensure that this information is made available to the American people.² We are enclosing a classified letter that identifies these four footnotes and explains the importance of this information to a complete understanding of the OIG report and the underlying Crossfire Hurricane investigation.



Dear Acting Director Grenell:

I am writing to express my concern that you are pursuing organizational and personnel changes at the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) without consulting and seeking authorization from Congress and in a manner that undermines critical intelligence functions. This effort appears to be proceeding despite the Coronavirus pandemic and amid indications, exemplified by a March 10 briefing to Members of Congress, of political interference in the production and dissemination of intelligence. These developments call into question both your commitment to ensuring that the Intelligence Community's (IC) work on behalf of our nation is not inappropriately influenced by political considerations, as required by law and that the IC will continue to speak truth to power.

Consistent with Congress' longstanding, bipartisan commitment to ensuring the independence of the IC, the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (the Committee) will undertake additional oversight of the following intelligence activities:

1. Reorganization of ODNI. Congress has neither authorized organizational changes at ODNI, nor appropriated funds for that purpose. Additionally, ODNI has not communicated to the Committee any intelligence rationale for potential changes to ODNI's staffing and structure, including reductions to the staff of the National Counterterrorism Center (NCTC) or in the overall number of IC personnel detailed to ODNI in support of core functions. The Committee is concerned, moreover, by the removal or departure of every Senate-confirmed official at ODNI, as well as of other senior officials across ODNI's leadership team, including NCTC Acting Director Russell Travers and Acting Deputy Director Peter Hall.

President Trump did not nominate you for confirmation as permanent DNI, and it would be inappropriate for you to pursue any additional leadership, organizational, or staffing changes to ODNI during your temporary tenure. Any effort, moreover, to remove or otherwise initiate personnel actions against apolitical career officers based on their perceived loyalty to the President would contravene civil service protections.

To inform the Committee's oversight, you are requested to provide by April 16, 2020: (a) a detailed written explanation for all potential organizational and personnel changes at ODNI, including, but not limited to, NCTC, under active consideration; (b) a list of all third parties with whom you or your staff consulted regarding the potential organizational changes; and (c) all internal communications and records, including any with the White House, pertaining to the removal of Russell Travers as Acting Director of NCTC and the departure of Peter Hall as Acting Deputy Director.

2. Termination of the IC Inspector General (IC IG). Late in the evening of April 3, President Trump announced that he was firing Michael Atkinson, the Inspector General of the Intelligence Community (IC IG). The next day, the President confirmed publicly that he had fired Mr. Atkinson because Mr. Atkinson had sought to transmit to the congressional intelligence committees a credible whistleblower complaint of urgent concern—one that implicated the President himself and was required by law to be transmitted to Congress.¹ President Trump's remarks leave no doubt that his firing of Mr. Atkinson was politically motivated reprisal. As Mr. Atkinson himself observed on April 5, "it is hard not to think that the President's loss of confidence in me derives from my having faithfully discharged my legal obligations as an independent and impartial Inspector General, and from my commitment to continue to do so."²

Mr. Atkinson acted with the highest integrity and remarkable professionalism, even as he was falsely attacked by the President and his supporters in Congress for staying true to his oath. Your predecessor, then-Acting DNI Joseph Maguire, confirmed this when he testified before the Committee in September 2019 that Mr. Atkinson's handling of the Ukraine whistleblower matter was fully consistent with the law and established procedures. Consequently, the Committee is reviewing the circumstances of Mr. Atkinson's dismissal, including whether his termination was intended to curb any ongoing investigations or reviews being undertaken by his office.

Pursuant to 50 U.S.C. § 5033(f), you are hereby requested to confirm in writing to the Committee by April 16, 2020, whether you have ever exercised your authority to prohibit Mr. Atkinson, or recently named Acting IC IG, Thomas Monheim, from "initiating, carrying out, or completing any investigation, inspection, audit, or review" and, if so, the nature of the investigation(s) prohibited and the reasons for the exercise of such authority.

The Committee also requests that you provide by April 16, 2020, a written certification from the Acting General Counsel of ODNI that officials, yourself included, will not permit

retaliation or reprisals against anyone who has made, or in the future makes, protected disclosures of misconduct to Congress or Inspectors General.

Finally, you are also reminded of your legal obligation under 50 U.S.C. § 5033(k)(1) to submit to the Committee **on or before May 30**, **2020** the IC IG's semi-annual report for the six-month period ending March 31, 2020. By law, that report must contain, among other things: (1) a "list of the title or subject of each investigation, inspection, audit, or review conducted during the period covered by such report"; (2) a "description of significant problems, abuses, and deficiencies relating to the administration of programs and activities of the intelligence community within the responsibility and authority of the [DNI]"; and (3) a "certification of whether or not the Inspector General has had full and direct access to all information relevant to the performance of the functions of the Inspector General."³

3. Election Security. Reports indicate that one or more members of your staff may be inappropriately interfering with the production and briefing of intelligence information on election security to Congress, including information that was briefed to all Members on March 10.⁴ If accurate, this politicization of intelligence would constitute a grave breach of your duty as Acting DNI to preserve the independence of the IC, protect the integrity of U.S. elections, and keep the Congress fully and currently informed of intelligence activities, including by providing national intelligence that is "independent of political considerations."⁵ Furthermore, it calls into doubt whether Congress and the American people can trust that the IC will continue producing unvarnished intelligence assessments on foreign interference efforts as the 2020 presidential election approaches. The Committee will be undertaking vigorous oversight of these matters and expects that ODNI will refrain from seeking to influence or otherwise interfere in the collection, analysis, and dissemination of intelligence, including to Congress.

As part of the Committee's oversight, you are requested to produce to the Committee by April 16, 2020, any and all communications regarding the participation of the Director of the National Counterintelligence and Security Center in the March 10 briefing, as well as any and all communications regarding the assessment that he presented at the briefing. Further, the next elections security quarterly update to House committees from the Intelligence Community Executive and Leadership Board is due in May. It is critical that Congress remain apprised of activities surrounding the security of the 2020 presidential election,

especially during the Coronavirus pandemic. Accordingly, the Committee requests a written elections security update by May 30, 2020.

The Committee expects ODNI's full cooperation on these and other matters, consistent with the statutory obligation, pursuant to 50 U.S.C. § 3091, to keep the Committee "fully and currently informed of the intelligence activities of the United States," and also in furtherance of the constructive relationship that has existed between the Committee and your office under prior DNIs. I also look forward to your appearance before the Committee at the earliest practicable opportunity.



Dear Attorney General Barr and Acting Director Grenell:

After careful review and in concurrence with requests made by Senator Grassley and others, I write to urge the declassification of redacted information contained in the December 2019 report by Department of Justice Inspector General Michael Horowitz, which detailed abuses related to the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act.

It is my strong belief that information redacted from the Inspector General's public report provides compelling evidence necessary to fully understand the severity of the misconduct. As such, additional transparency is of the highest public interest. Declassification is also necessary to expose actions, including possible criminal wrongdoing, by former officials and certain senior Intelligence Community and law enforcement officials.

In light of the magnitude of these abuses, as many redactions as possible should be removed from the Inspector General's report, with the proper attention paid to protecting legitimate sources and methods.

Dear Ambassador Grenell:

I write to express my concerns with respect to the inadequate safeguarding of classified information shared with the House of Representatives, specifically, the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI or the Committee) of which I serve as Ranking Member.

Since the election of President Trump, secret innuendo and selective leaks of classified information have been used by the Administration's opponents to undermine the President and advance partisan political interests. Unfortunately, several sources of alleged leaked information have been attributed to closed door intelligence briefings and hearings held by HPSCI.

In addition to leaks associated with Committee events, there is a risk of leaks of information associated with intelligence information provided to HPSCI, such as serialized intelligence reports. This risk is clearly evident upon examination of document production requests from the Committee to the Intelligence Community (IC) during the House Majority's 2019 impeachment inquiry. As you know, impeachment is a purely political exercise, and an evaluation of the numerous partisan requests transmitted from HPSCI to the IC leads to the singular conclusion that information is being sought by the Committee for political and not legitimate oversight purposes.

For example, the Committee sought intelligence reports on named foreign persons who are themselves legitimate foreign intelligence targets but, most importantly, are believed by the Chairman to have been in contact with one of his political opponents—a U.S. person. The classified document requests are best characterized as a political fishing expedition and an abuse of power by the Chairman.

The use of the IC to advance a personal vendetta against political opponents is abhorrent. The fact that these requests are shrouded in the cloak of "legitimate Congressional oversight" does not alter this fundamental fact. Any information produced as a result of these requests may be selectively leaked, which is the only logical motivation for such activity.

As a former Chairman of the Committee, I must underscore that requests for documents and other material from the IC has been an important part of lawful Congressional oversight

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work. The Committee has a legitimate oversight need to review such information. What is unprecedented and improper is the political nature of such requests.

Committee Republicans have directly confronted the Chairman about the number of leaks that are directly or likely related to Committee activity. There are numerous mechanisms that have long been in place to ensure proper safeguarding of classified information by the Committee. However, the effectiveness of these measures is largely dependent on the commitment of the Committee's Chairman. They include:

- Executive Session: The Committee conducts the majority of its work, including unclassified business, in executive session. This establishes an additional requirement of a full committee vote prior to the release of any transcripts or documents.
- Secrecy Oath: Members of Congress must sign a secrecy oath as a condition of receiving classified information. This is documented in the Congressional record.
- Committee Oath: Members and staff must sign an additional secrecy oath maintained by the Committee.
- Non-Disclosure Agreements: Committee staff sign non-disclosure agreements prior to receiving access to classified information. For the more sensitive programs and activities, additional non-disclosure agreements are required and the number of staff with access is limited.
- Security Clearances: Committee staff are required to maintain, at minimum, a Top Secret security clearance, pursuant to applicable laws and policy, and are subject to periodic re-investigations conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation every five years.
- Committee Rules: Members and staff are prohibited from discussing or disclosing the classified substance of the work of the Committee, any information received in executive session, any classified information from any source, the substance of any hearings that was closed to the public. The Chairman is responsible for the supervision and direction of security and nondisclosure of classified information.
- Federal Laws: The Espionage Act and other federal laws apply to Members of Congress and staff.

As previously noted, the above mechanisms are dependent on the Committee Chairman's commitment to safeguarding classified information. That commitment is no longer evident. The resulting impact on national security has been very serious, in some instances threatening the lives of intelligence assets and blinding our nation to streams of information needed to protect the American people from foreign threats. Due to the justifiable need to protect sources and methods, the real damage of these leaks remains classified. However, in the absence of prosecutions, political activists throughout the government are emboldened to commit their own criminal disclosures.

The significance of the problem, as well as the cavalier attitude of some Members of Congress toward secrecy, was plainly evident during a February 13, 2020 election security briefing. During that classified briefing, a Democratic Member of the Committee made a statement suggesting the need of Members to discuss the content of the classified briefing. The

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Member's statement was not itself evidence of a leak, but it demonstrates that the secrecy of Committee proceedings is not respected by all Members.

During my tenure as Chairman, I frequently admonished Members and staff not to discuss any Committee business with the media, whether classified or not. In fact, most Committee events were noticed in a manner which sought to minimize publicity for the topics under examination. I frequently engaged with Members, House Leadership, and the Administration with my concerns related to leaks—chief among them the fact that the volume of leaks associated with Congressional oversight activities had risen sharply under President Trump. Some of these leaks were documented in the Committee's March 2018 Report on Russian Active Measures.

The identification of those responsible for leaks, particularly without the cooperation of Congress, may be challenging. Leaks could be from Administration officials, Committee Members, staff, or a combination thereof. Others within the IC could also be responsible, timing their leaks to coincide with publicly announced Committee events. However, the direct association of leaks with Committee oversight activity suggests that Congressional oversight is being used to shield criminal disclosures.

As Acting Director of National Intelligence, I urge you to consider the imposition of access limitations for categories of information likely to be leaked for political purposes. To accomplish this, you could leverage appropriate mechanisms, such as Gang of Eight restrictions, which protect the legitimate oversight functions of Congress.

In addition, engagements with the House of Representatives should be carefully evaluated on the basis of security until a bipartisan consensus can be reached that information will be properly safeguarded from unauthorized disclosure. I am confident you can achieve improved security against leaks while preserving necessary Congressional oversight, particularly if engagement and access by Members and staff follow the longstanding policy of "need to know."

You can be assured of my support for such action, and I am confident you will receive the support of House Republicans and all Americans who share a desire to prevent the intentional unauthorized disclosures of classified information for political purposes.

I thank you for your prompt attention to this matter.

As we explained in our May 12, 2020, letter to you, one of the most significant unanswered questions about what occurred during the 2016 election is how many Americans were "unmasked," at whose request, and for what purpose.³ It has become evident that the FBI, and possibly members of the U.S. Intelligence Community, were focused on U.S. persons affiliated with the Trump campaign in early 2016, if not even earlier.⁴ One example is that, in April 2016, FBI headquarters directed its New York Field Office to open a counterintelligence investigation of Carter Page, which on August 10, 2016, became part of the Crossfire Hurricane investigation.5

General Michael Flynn, paint a more and more troubling picture of the conduct that we have been investigating since 2017. However, we firmly believe that the best way to resolve these issues is to determine the truth, and to make clear to the American people what did and did not occur.

For these reasons, we respectfully request that you make available to us, as soon as possible, all information regarding the "unmasking" of U.S. persons requested by members of President Obama's administration around the time of the 2016 election through January 2017.

Consistent with Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Vice Chairman Mark Warner's May 20, 2020 letter to you, the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence ("Committee") also requests that you produce the intelligence reports and additional information pertaining to your May 8 declassification, and May 13 release to Senators Ron Johnson and Charles Grassley, of the identities of executive branch officials who lawfully submitted U.S. person identity requests to better understand specific intelligence reports containing masked U.S. person information.

The Intelligence Community ("IC") protects the identities of Americans who are referenced in intelligence obtained from lawful collection against authorized foreign targets that it disseminates to its customers through intelligence reports. IC elements do so by "masking" the U.S. person information in the intelligence report in a manner that protects those U.S. persons' privacy. U.S. officials who are authorized recipients of these intelligence reports and who are charged with protecting national security may request, through a standardized process and with an appropriate and validated justification, the underlying U.S. person information that has been replaced by a generic descriptor (such as "U.S. person 1"). The IC elements review those requests to validate the requester's need to know this sensitive information before releasing that U.S. person information to the requester.

As you must now be aware, authorized U.S. officials make these requests so they can better understand specific intelligence reports and properly evaluate threats to our national security. The established procedures for doing so safeguard the privacy of Americans, while at the same time enabling U.S. officials to protect national security by requesting the U.S. person information that reveals who may be in harm's way, who may be engaged in acts that threaten the country, or who, wittingly or unwittingly, may be acting to further the interests of foreign adversaries and, therefore, pose a counterintelligence risk or threat.

In late 2016 and early 2017, as the scope of Russia's sweeping and systemic interference in our election was coming into focus, dozens of officials from across the U.S. government were

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briefed on intelligence reports on foreign actors that contained masked U.S. person information. As the list you declassified shows, these officials, either directly or through their IC briefers, submitted requests to understand who the U.S. person or persons were who were referenced in these reports on foreign targets. The masked U.S. persons referenced in these reports were revealed to be Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Michael Flynn, who served as an advisor to candidate and then President-elect Donald Trump—even as Lt. Gen. Flynn was working as an unregistered agent of a foreign government seeking to influence U.S. policy through at least mid-November 2016.¹

National Security Agency ("NSA") Director General Paul Nakasone's May 4, 2020 response to your request, which you declassified, confirmed that each of the U.S. officials who requested the masked U.S. person information was "an authorized recipient of the original report" and the requests to reveal the masked U.S. person information were "approved through NSA's standard process, which includes a review of the justification for the request."²

As detailed in charging documents and Special Counsel Robert Mueller's *Report on the Investigation into Russian Interference in the 2016 Presidential Election*, during this timeframe, the IC also became aware of Lt. Gen. Flynn's communications with Russian Ambassador Sergey Kislyak regarding, among other things, sanctions that the United States had recently imposed on Russia as a penalty for its interference in the 2016 presidential election.³ Lt. Gen. Flynn did not disclose these communications with the Russian Ambassador to the outgoing administration, despite the long-established principle that the United States has only one government at a time.⁴

In January 2017, Lt. Gen. Flynn lied about the content of these communications to Vice President-elect Mike Pence and—after he began serving as President Trump's National Security Advisor—to the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI").⁵ This created a clear and untenable counterintelligence and national security risk for the United States.⁶ As witnesses testified to the Committee, the Senate, and to Special Counsel Mueller, Lt. Gen. Flynn's readily provable lies provided the Russians leverage over the new National Security Advisor because they knew he

was lying about the substance of his conversations with Ambassador Kislyak. Lt. Gen. Flynn, himself, later pleaded guilty under oath—twice—to lying to the FBI about these communications. Even President Trump publicly explained at the time, "I had to fire General Flynn because he lied to the vice president and the FBI."⁷

Your decision to declassify the list of executive branch officials that you requested NSA compile, and then asked that NSA revise to your specification, is without precedent. It was a transparent political act—in an election year and during a pandemic, no less—in which you used the authorities of your position to insinuate wrongdoing by officials who acted appropriately in requesting the identity of masked U.S. persons to better understand foreign intelligence reports.⁸ This is inconsistent with the oath and obligations of an acting Director of National Intelligence. Selective declassification for political purposes is inappropriate, corrupt, and undermines public confidence in the IC as an apolitical pillar protecting the country regardless of the political affiliation of its Executive Branch customers.

To ensure a transparent and complete public record free of political manipulation, the Committee therefore requests that you or your successor:

- 1. Declassify and make publicly available any intelligence report or transcript concerning conversations between Lt. Gen. Flynn and former Russian Ambassador Kislyak. These communications have been the subject of thorough law enforcement investigation and criminal proceedings, and no national security rationale remains to suppress these records on classification grounds.
- 2. Produce to the Committee in full, consistent with 50 USC §3092(a)(2),⁹ the underlying intelligence reports that were the subject of U.S. person identity requests revealed in General Nakasone's May 4, 2020 memorandum to you, as well as the rationale for your decision to request and then declassify the list of officials.
- 3. Declassify and make publicly available, with appropriate redactions to protect sensitive sources and methods, these same underlying intelligence reports, so that the public can understand why so many U.S. officials from across the government independently sought to learn the identity of a masked American, who would turn out to be Lt. Gen. Flynn, who was communicating with or referenced by lawful targets of foreign intelligence collection.

Dear Acting Director Grenell:

I write to understand your involvement in President Trump's decision to fire Mr. Michael K. Atkinson as the Intelligence Community Inspector General (ICIG). In your recent March 23, 2020 letter to Chairman Burr and myself, you explicitly committed to us that you were undertaking a review of ODNI, but that we should "[Re]st assured that this review is not an effort to purge ... the ODNI, as some have erroneously suggested." However, a mere 10 days later, that is exactly what is occurring. I therefore ask you answer the following questions:

- 1. Did President Trump either consult with or inform you that he would be firing Mr. Atkinson at any time prior to the decision being made public on April 3, 2020?
- 2. If the President consulted with or informed you of the firing prior to the announcement, what reasons did the President provide for the firing? Have you been made aware of any concern the President may have with the actions of ICIG Atkinson that does not involve the handling of the whistleblower complaint that led to the President's impeachment?
- 3. Do you concur with the decision to fire Mr. Atkinson?
- 4. By his actions and the reforms he had undertaken at the office of the ICIG, Mr. Atkinson demonstrated an unwavering commitment to empower those who witness potential waste, fraud, or abuse, to come forward. His firing now leaves no Senate-confirmed leaders in the Office of the Director of National Intelligence. What message do you believe this conveys to the American people in terms of the importance of leading and overseeing intelligence in support of our national security?

Thank you for your prompt attention to this matter.

Dear Acting Director Grenell:

I write with several requests regarding your May 13, 2020, letter to Senators Charles E. Grassley and Ron Johnson in which you declassified the identities of executive branch officials who exercised their right, consistent with the law, to understand the identity of an individual in specific intelligence reports.

As you are well aware, there are substantial protections built into the process for requesting that identities of U.S. persons be unmasked in intelligence reports, ensuring that the rights of individual Americans are protected and that unmasking requests are granted only to those who need the information in order to protect U.S. national security. As you also know, there are thousands of such requests each year, each subject to the same process before it is approved. Nor, as you know, is this process unique to a single presidential administration. In fact, according to ODNI's annual transparency reports, between 2017 and 2018, the number of unmasked identities jumped from 9,529 in 2017 to 16,721 in 2018 under the Trump administration. In 2019, the total of unmasked identities reached 10,012.

I ask that you provide the Committee with the underlying intelligence reports in which the identity of the individual was "unmasked" to be Lt. Gen. Michael Flynn (ret.).

Additionally, I ask you to provide the rationale for declassifying these unmasking requests, given the potential compromise to sources and methods, and that this declassification occurred well short of the timeline required under Executive Order 13526. Just as Sec 1.7 of that Order prohibits over-classification for inappropriate reasons, selective declassification for political purposes undermines the integrity of our system for protecting classified information, undermines the Intelligence Community's credibility, and erodes public trust in institutions critical to protecting the nation.

Therefore, in order to more fully and properly inform the American people of the events surrounding the unmasking of Lt. Gen. Flynn (ret.), I further request that you declassify and make publicly available any intelligence report concerning conversations between Lt. Gen. Flynn (ret.) and Russian Ambassador to the United States, Sergey Kislyak. These calls have been the topic of the multiple investigations, trials, and plea agreements concerning General Flynn and merit being in the public domain, consistent with Executive Order, Sec 3.1(d).

Thank you for your kind attention to these requests. I look forward to your response.



Dear Mr. President:

We, as members of the "Gang of Eight," write to reiterate your obligations to consult Congress prior to taking military action overseas. Recent attacks in Iraq, ongoing violence in Syria, and dynamics in Libya, among other events, highlight dynamic threats to U.S. interests that could involve the U.S. military. Further, recent media reports indicate that the administration has actively considered, and may still be considering, direct action against Iran due to actions by Iranian-sponsored militias in Iraq.

While there are well-understood and narrow self-defense exceptions, the Constitution and U.S. law require you to consult with Congress before engaging in military action or actions likely to lead to war. This Administration has largely failed to fulfill this legal obligation, including in the case of your decision to strike Iranian Revolutionary Guard Corps Quds Force Commander Qassim Soleimani earlier this year.

We appreciate the Intelligence Community's ongoing efforts, consistent with its legal obligations, to keep us, and Congress more broadly, informed about threats to the United States and our interests. However, intelligence briefings required by the National Security Act of 1947 do not constitute or substitute for consultations about policy responses and the use of force. We expect you and your administration to adhere to constitutional and legal requirements to consult with Congress prior to any decision about the use of military force.



Dear Acting Director Rigas, Ambassador Grenell, and Under Secretary Kernan:

I write to ask you as the principal members of the Performance Accountability Council to ensure the robustness of the background investigative capacity to support the security clearance process during the current pandemic.

The coronavirus is exposing the potential fragility in our background investigation infrastructure. Departments and agencies have slowed hiring for government employees and contractors, leading to fewer requests of authorized investigative service providers for background investigations. A reduced caseload poses several risks. Background investigator firms may no longer remain financially viable without a sufficient caseload. The reserve in the working capital fund at the Defense Counterintelligence and Security Agency (DCSA), which provides 95 percent of the government's background investigations, may drop below a level necessary to sustain its operations. Finally, a drop in cases now will lead to a surge of investigations once the pandemic recedes, leading to another backlog and unavoidable delays in processing.

In sum, without proper attention to background investigation capacity and the workforce that supports it, we risk recreating the crisis we experienced in 2014 and the years that followed: a spike in the inventory and processing timelines nearly triple the targets established in law.

We must ensure departments, agencies, and their industry partners continue to submit background investigation requests on hired personnel, assess appropriate measures to sustain the background investigative workforce during a slowdown, and preserve or supplement DCSA's working capital fund.

I look forward to working with you on these matters as we continue to implement Trusted Workforce 2.0 to transform our personnel vetting enterprise.



Director Grenell,

The ability of the United States to modernize our military forces to overmatch our adversaries requires intelligence support. Intelligence is needed to understand and anticipate foreign doctrine and the intent of foreign leaders, prevent tactical and operational surprise, and ensure that U.S. capabilities are not compromised before they are fielded. In addition, virtually all modern weapon systems depend upon data derived from scientific and technical intelligence.

In February of last year, myself and Members of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI) received a briefing regarding a gap of the US render safe capabilities against near peer competitors and regional adversaries regarding the development of render safe capabilities of foreign ordnance which we acknowledge as explosive ordnance intelligence (EO INT). There is no formal process addressing the US gap; furthermore, weapons and weapons system technical Intelligence (TECHINT) does not address fuzing, firing and render safe of foreign explosive ordnance (EO). We agree with the concept that the US IC/DIE lacks explosive ordnance, render safe subject matter experts (SME) who understand all aspects of fuzing, firing systems and disassembly of foreign ordnance. We believe that embedded render safe SMEs (EOD) need to be full members of the IC/DIE similarly as geospatial engineering technicians are used (former topographic engineering).

The working definition of EO INT is a subcategory of TECHINT focused on processing, production, dissemination, integration, exploitation, evaluation, feedback and analysis of explosive ordnance that utilizes the skills, techniques, principles and knowledge of EOD personnel on fuzing, firing systems, ordnance disassembly and development of render safe techniques, procedures and tools, publications, and applied technologies.

This concept also utilizes EO Open Source Intelligence (EO OSINT) data/information which is not currently captured, shared or analyzed as necessary. The concept uses various open source render safe, explosive ordnance identification currently developed by various NGO UXO/Demining organizations especially in areas where the US is not the lead.


Request that your Office assist as follows:

Consistent with Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Vice Chairman Mark Warner's May 20, 2020 letter to you, the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence ("Committee") also requests that you produce the intelligence reports and additional information pertaining to your May 8 declassification, and May 13 release to Senators Ron Johnson and Charles Grassley, of the identities of executive branch officials who lawfully submitted U.S. person identity requests to better understand specific intelligence reports containing masked U.S. person information.

The Intelligence Community ("IC") protects the identities of Americans who are referenced in intelligence obtained from lawful collection against authorized foreign targets that it disseminates to its customers through intelligence reports. IC elements do so by "masking" the U.S. person information in the intelligence report in a manner that protects those U.S. persons' privacy. U.S. officials who are authorized recipients of these intelligence reports and who are charged with protecting national security may request, through a standardized process and with an appropriate and validated justification, the underlying U.S. person information that has been replaced by a generic descriptor (such as "U.S. person 1"). The IC elements review those requests to validate the requester's need to know this sensitive information before releasing that U.S. person information to the requester.

As you must now be aware, authorized U.S. officials make these requests so they can better understand specific intelligence reports and properly evaluate threats to our national security. The established procedures for doing so safeguard the privacy of Americans, while at the same time enabling U.S. officials to protect national security by requesting the U.S. person information that reveals who may be in harm's way, who may be engaged in acts that threaten the country, or who, wittingly or unwittingly, may be acting to further the interests of foreign adversaries and, therefore, pose a counterintelligence risk or threat.

In late 2016 and early 2017, as the scope of Russia's sweeping and systemic interference in our election was coming into focus, dozens of officials from across the U.S. government were briefed on intelligence reports on foreign actors that contained masked U.S. person information. As the list you declassified shows, these officials, either directly or through their IC briefers, submitted requests to understand who the U.S. person or persons were who were referenced in these reports on foreign targets. The masked U.S. persons referenced in these reports were revealed to be Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Michael Flynn, who served as an advisor to candidate and then President-elect Donald Trump—even as Lt. Gen. Flynn was working as an unregistered agent of a foreign government seeking to influence U.S. policy through at least mid-November 2016.¹

National Security Agency ("NSA") Director General Paul Nakasone's May 4, 2020 response to your request, which you declassified, confirmed that each of the U.S. officials who requested the masked U.S. person information was "an authorized recipient of the original report" and the requests to reveal the masked U.S. person information were "approved through NSA's standard process, which includes a review of the justification for the request."²

As detailed in charging documents and Special Counsel Robert Mueller's *Report on the Investigation into Russian Interference in the 2016 Presidential Election*, during this timeframe, the IC also became aware of Lt. Gen. Flynn's communications with Russian Ambassador Sergey Kislyak regarding, among other things, sanctions that the United States had recently imposed on Russia as a penalty for its interference in the 2016 presidential election.³ Lt. Gen. Flynn did not disclose these communications with the Russian Ambassador to the outgoing administration, despite the long-established principle that the United States has only one government at a time.⁴

In January 2017, Lt. Gen. Flynn lied about the content of these communications to Vice President-elect Mike Pence and—after he began serving as President Trump's National Security Advisor—to the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI").⁵ This created a clear and untenable counterintelligence and national security risk for the United States.⁶ As witnesses testified to the Committee, the Senate, and to Special Counsel Mueller, Lt. Gen. Flynn's readily provable lies provided the Russians leverage over the new National Security Advisor because they knew he

was lying about the substance of his conversations with Ambassador Kislyak. Lt. Gen. Flynn, himself, later pleaded guilty under oath—twice—to lying to the FBI about these communications. Even President Trump publicly explained at the time, "I had to fire General Flynn because he lied to the vice president and the FBI."⁷

Your decision to declassify the list of executive branch officials that you requested NSA compile, and then asked that NSA revise to your specification, is without precedent. It was a transparent political act—in an election year and during a pandemic, no less—in which you used the authorities of your position to insinuate wrongdoing by officials who acted appropriately in requesting the identity of masked U.S. persons to better understand foreign intelligence reports.⁸ This is inconsistent with the oath and obligations of an acting Director of National Intelligence. Selective declassification for political purposes is inappropriate, corrupt, and undermines public confidence in the IC as an apolitical pillar protecting the country regardless of the political affiliation of its Executive Branch customers.

To ensure a transparent and complete public record free of political manipulation, the Committee therefore requests that you or your successor:

- 1. Declassify and make publicly available any intelligence report or transcript concerning conversations between Lt. Gen. Flynn and former Russian Ambassador Kislyak. These communications have been the subject of thorough law enforcement investigation and criminal proceedings, and no national security rationale remains to suppress these records on classification grounds.
- 2. Produce to the Committee in full, consistent with 50 USC §3092(a)(2),⁹ the underlying intelligence reports that were the subject of U.S. person identity requests revealed in General Nakasone's May 4, 2020 memorandum to you, as well as the rationalc for your decision to request and then declassify the list of officials.
- 3. Declassify and make publicly available, with appropriate redactions to protect sensitive sources and methods, these same underlying intelligence reports, so that the public can understand why so many U.S. officials from across the government independently sought to learn the identity of a masked American, who would turn out to be Lt. Gen. Flynn, who was communicating with or referenced by lawful targets of foreign intelligence collection.





This letter is an interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated 27 April 2021, in which you requested the following:

- 1. All emails, text messages, including attachments, sent and received by former Principal Deputy to the Acting Director of National Intelligence Kash Patel.
- 2. All memos, reports, briefing materials sent to and prepared for Kash Patel.

Your request was being processed in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. This response addresses the processing of ten (10) documents responsive to item number one of your aforementioned request. Upon review, we have determined that one (1) document is being release to you in full (Bates Pages 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000210 – 000211). Further, nine (9) documents are being released to you in part (Bates Pages 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000209 and 000212 – 000224) pursuant to the following FOIA exemptions:

- (b)(3), which applies to information exempt from disclosure by statute, and, in this case, specifically the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, statue 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m), which protects identifying information of ODNI personnel;
- (b)(6), which applies to information, the release of which would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

The Department of Defense withheld information pursuante to FOIA exemption (b)(6). The Department of State and the National Security Council each withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(5) and (b)(6):

• (b)(5), which applies to information that concerns communications within or between agencies that are protected by legal privileges.

In addition to the above documents, the ODNI has processed 293 additional pages concerning item number 1 of your request. Those pages were identified as responsive and sent out for consultation with other government agencies this month.

Dear Secretary Pompeo, Attorney General Barr, and Acting Director Grenell,

We write today to express alarm regarding recent reports of an attempted raid on Venezuela allegedly orchestrated by a group of Venezuelan military defectors and two American citizens. These developments raise a number of concerns regarding U.S. policy and questions about potential violations of U.S. law.

Jordan Goudreau, a former U.S. Army Green Beret and founder of the private security firm Silvercorp USA, has claimed responsibility for a failed amphibious assault on May 3rd aimed at capturing Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro. Venezuelan authorities have stated that eight people were killed and two Americans were captured in the operation.

This recent attack is reportedly the product of an effort by former Venezuelan military officers and Goudreau to organize dozens of deserters from Venezuela's security forces in Colombia, in order to stage a cross-border incursion into Venezuela to capture Maduro. News of Goudreau's thwarted amphibious operation follows the seizure by Colombian police in March of a truck transporting a cache of weapons and tactical equipment worth around \$150,000, including scopes, night vision goggles, radios, and 26 American-made assault rifles. Fifteen helmets manufactured by High-End Defense Solutions, a Miami-based military equipment vendor, were also seized by Colombian authorities. Cliver Alcalá, a former Venezuelan officer and associate of Goudreau's, claimed ownership of the confiscated arms. Notably, to demonstrate his ties to the opposition, Goudreau has produced what he alleges is a \$213 million contract for unspecified "general services" signed by members of Juan Guaidó's "Strategy Committee."

Either the U.S. government was unaware of these planned operations, or was aware and allowed them to proceed. Both possibilities are problematic. As you know, the *VERDAD Act*, which President Trump signed into law on December 20, 2019, states that "it is the policy of the United States to support diplomatic engagement in order to advance a negotiated and peaceful solution to Venezuela's political, economic, and humanitarian crisis." Armed raids, even if they are carried out by independent actors, run counter to that policy. Moreover, such incursions harm the prospects for a peaceful democratic transition in Venezuela by insinuating that an armed intervention is a viable option to resolve the crisis, potentially undermining the willingness of

hardline opposition actors to negotiate, while simultaneously allowing Maduro to rally support to his side, strengthening his hand.

To address our concerns, we request answers to the following questions. We understand that some information may need to be provided in classified form.

- Was the administration aware, either directly or through the Venezuelan or Colombian government, of the plans by Jordan Goudreau to instigate an armed attack inside Venezuela, and of his communication with advisors to Juan Guaidó in Miami?
- If the administration was aware of Goudreau's plans, did you take any steps to prevent it from moving forward? Did the U.S. government provide, directly or indirectly, any financial, material, training, intelligence, or other kinds of support to this operation?
- Goudreau has claimed that he is aware of additional forces in and around Venezuela ready to be activated as part of his effort to oust Maduro; what is the intelligence community's assessment of the extent of his operation?
- What steps is the administration taking to secure the release of the two American citizens that have been captured by Maduro's forces during the attack?
- Does the intelligence community assess the contract that Goudreau claims was signed by Juan Guaidó, or members of his "Strategic Committee," is legitimate? If so, were steps taken to ensure that U.S. funds were not implicated in this contract?
- Has the U.S. government ever provided, directly or indirectly, financial, material, training, intelligence, or any other type of assistance to opposition-aligned actors seeking to carry out an armed operation in Venezuelan territory?

Maduro is a dictator, and the Venezuelan people deserve to live in a democracy again, but that will only be achieved through vigorous and effective diplomacy, not martial adventurism. We hope you agree, and look forward to receiving answers to these questions.

This letter is an interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated 27 April 2021, in which you requested the following:

- 1. All emails, text messages, including attachments, sent and received by former Principal Deputy to the Acting Director of National Intelligence Kash Patel.
- 2. All memos, reports, briefing materials sent to and prepared for Kash Patel.

Your request is being processed in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. This response addresses the processing of documents responsive to both items of your aforementioned request (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 001408 – 001713). In response to item number one of your request, one (1) document is being released to you in full (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-000201) 001427). Additionally, twenty-four (24) documents are being released to you in part (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 001408 – 001409, 001413 – 001420, 001424, 001426, 001428 – 001443), pursuant to the following FOIA exemptions:

- (b)(3), which applies to information exempt from disclosure by statute, and, in this case, the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i) and 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m), which protect intelligence sources and methods and identifying information of ODNI personnel, respectively;
- (b)(5), which applies to information that concerns protected communications and communications within or between agencies which are protected by legal privileges; and
- (b)(6), which applies to information, the release of which would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

We have determined that three (3) documents must be denied in full (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 001410 - 001412, 001421 - 001423, and 001425), pursuant to the aforementioned FOIA exemptions.

In response to item number two of your request, we have determint that 269 pages full (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 001444 - 001713) must be withheld in full, pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and (b)(5). Exemption (b)(1) applies to information that is currently and properly classified pursuant to Executive Order 13526, Section 1.4(c);

During the review process, we considered the foreseeable harm standard and have determined that the withheld information is not releasable.

It is my understanding that the prosecution team led by Connecticut U.S. Attorney John Durham, who has been assigned by Attorney General Bill Barr to investigate the roots of 2016 investigations into allegations that President Trump and his campaign were linked to or influenced by Russia, recently approached former British intelligence officer and "dossier" author Christopher Steele for an interview. This letter is an interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated 22 April 2021, in which you requested the following:

- 1. All emails, text messages, including attachments, sent and received by former Principal Deputy to the Acting Director of National Intelligence Kash Patel.
- 2. All memos, reports, briefing materials sent to and prepared for Kash Patel.

Your request is being processed in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. This response addresses the processing of documents responsive to item one of your aforementioned request (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 002207 - 002332). Upon review, one (1) document is being released in full (Bates Page: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 002306). One-hundred (100) documents are being released to you in part (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-000201) 002207 - 002305 and 002307 - 002332), pursuant to the following FOIA exemptions:

- (b)(3), which applies to information exempt from disclosure by statute. Specifically, in this case, that statute is the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i) and 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m), which protect intelligence sources and methods and identifying information of ODNI personnel, respectively; and
- (b)(6), which applies to information, the release of which would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

Additionally, The National Security Council withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(5), and (b)(6). Exemption (b)(1) pertains to information that is currently and properly classified pursuant of Executive Order 13526. Exemption (b)(5) pertains to information that concerns communications within or between agencies that are protected by legal privileges.

During the review process, we considered the foreseeable harm standard and have determined that the withheld information is not releasable.

In addition to the above documents, the ODNI has processed 229 additional pages concerning item number 1 of your request. Those pages were identified as responsive and sent out for consultation with other government agencies this month.

JERUSALEM (Reuters) - An analysis of coronavirus patients voices could yield a vocal fingerprint to help detect COVID-19 symptoms in others and prioritize testing and treatment, the Israeli Defence Ministry said on Tuesday.

Starting this week, an Israeli startup company working with hospitals and academic institutions will sample voices of confirmed coronavirus patients through a mobile application in a research project led by the ministry.

These voice samples will be analyzed using an AI (Artificial Intelligence)-based algorithm in order to identify the unique vocal fingerprint, the ministry said in a statement.

The coronavirus affects the respiratory system and signs of distress can be reflected in the patterns of a person's voice and breathing.

Tal Wenderow, President and CEO of Vocalis Health, the company that developed the mobile app, said that the algorithm would be used for remote diagnosis and monitoring.

At this stage, the app would only be used by medical staff together with the patients taking part in the study, but the company's website allows for anyone to take part and send a voice sample to the researchers. Researchers hope that healthcare systems would be able to use the data to prioritize testing and hospitalization, allowing patients with light symptoms to stay at home.


The ministry said the monitoring system can be conducted from afar, in order to prevent the spread of the disease and overburdening of the national healthcare system.

Initial results of the study were expected within six weeks.

Israel has reported more than 1,600 coronavirus cases and three fatalities.

Sir, as we discussed at the staff meeting, attached are the two versions of volume 4 of the SSCI's report. This is the latest volume of a 5-volume Report drafted wholly by the SSCI. It is sent to the IC only for classification review – it is not endorsed by, nor a product of, the IC.

By way of background, over the last two years the SSCI created 5 volumes related to its investigation, covering: Election Security, Social Media, the 2017 IC Assessment (ICA) on Russian Active Measures, Policy Response, and Counterintellgence. Since last June, the IC has reviewed for classification and returned to the SSCI the volumes on Election Security, Social Media and Policy Response. Publicly releasable versions of those three volumes are currently available on the SSCI's website.

Attached is the IC's classification review of the 2017 ICA on Russian Active Measures, and we have not yet received Volume 5, on Counterintelligence, which is apparently over 1000 pages long.

We were also originally informed that the SSCI would draft three shorter reports on the DNC hacking, the FBI's CI investigations, and the Steele Dossier, that we would need to review for classification. We have not received those reports, nor have we heard anything about current status of those reports.

With regard specifically to Volume 4 on the ICA:


The attached publicly releasable version, which is heavily redacted, could be released to the public by the SSCI, as they have done with the prior three volumes.



We write in further regard to matters pertaining to the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act and other matters contained in the December 9, 2019 report by Department of Justice (Department) Inspector General Michael Horowitz.

As we described in our letter of February 10, 2020, the Attorney General has determined that it is now in the public interest to release to Congress additional documents and information related to these matters to the extent consistent with national security interests and with the January 7, 2020 order of the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court (FISC). Specifically, in response to your request for the production of unredacted versions of four footnotes in Inspector General Horowitz's report, the Department has undertaken a careful review of the underlying information. Enclosed with this letter are three footnotes with minimal redactions to protect national security interests. As we have discussed with your staff, disclosure of the fourth and final footnote presents unique and significant concerns. Specifically, the redacted information refers to information received by a member of the Crossfire Hurricane team regarding possible previous attempts by a foreign government to penetrate and research a company or individuals associated with Christopher Steele. Nevertheless, the Department continues to review and consider the possibility of further declassification or summary substitution.



I request that you also declassify and produce the underlying intelligence reports and other materials related to those unmasking requests. Specifically, I ask that you provide the Committee with:

- 1. All intelligence reports as to which officials made an unmasking request that revealed General Flynn's name, as listed in the document you provided to Senators Grassley and Johnson on May 13, 2020.
- 2. The transcripts of General Flynn's phone calls with Russian Ambassador Sergey Kislyak and any FBI reports summarizing their calls, which Senator Grassley and I requested in February 2017, as well as any other intelligence reports concerning these conversations.
- 3. To the extent you identify other unmasking requests responsive to Chairman Graham's May 19, 2020 letter, the intelligence reports as to which officials made each request.

As you are aware, on May 13, 2020, the Office of the Director of National Intelligence released a list of the identity of any official who submitted a request to the National Security Agency at any point between November 8, 2016, and January 31, 2017, to unmask the identity of former National Security Advisor, Lieutenant General Michael T. Flynn (Ret.). That list contained the identities of 39 officials who made requests to unmask General Flynn's identity.

Given the extensive number of requests for the unmasking of General Flynn's name during this short time period, it raises the question of whether these or other officials sought the unmasking of the identities of other individuals associated with the Trump campaign or transition team. Accordingly, I request that the Committee be provided with a list of the names of any officials who requested, between November 8, 2016, and January 31, 2017, to unmask the identities of those associated with the Trump campaign or transition team, including but not limited to Donald Trump, Donald Trump, Jr., Ivanka Trump, Jared Kushner, Corey Lewandowski, Paul Manafort, Steve Bannon, Kellyanne Conway, Sam Clovis, Christ Christie, Carter Page, and George Papadopoulos, and the reason given for any such request. In addition, I request an explanation as to why the list released on May 13th did not contain a record showing who unmasked General Flynn's identity for his phone call with Ambassador Kislyak.







An experienced public defender and Department of Justice (DOJ) terrorism prosecutor, Mr. Patel most recently served within the Multilateral Affairs Directorate on the NSC.

At the NSC, Kash oversees a team of dedicated U.S. government professionals responsible for the development of counterterrorism policies to address critical global security threats. These policies have contributed to some of the most consequential counterterrorism successes of the Trump administration, including the territorial defeat of ISIS in Iraq and Syria, the death of ISIS leader al-Baghdadi, the reform and implementation of numerous sanctions regimes, and the successful recovery of many Americans detained or held hostage abroad.

Prior to joining the NSC, Kash served as the National Security Advisor and Senior Counsel for the House Permanent Select Committee (HPSCI) on Intelligence, where he spearheaded the investigation into the active measures employed by Russia to influence the 2016 presidential election. While in this role, Kash also oversaw congressional oversight of sensitive intelligence and CT platforms around the world for our Intelligence and Special Forces communities. Before his time on Capitol Hill, Mr. Patel served as the DOJ liaison officer to the U.S. Military's Special Forces, assisting in interagency targeting efforts against top global counterterrorism targets.

A native of New York, Mr. Patel now lives in Washington, D.C. He completed his undergraduate studies at the University of Richmond in 2002, earned his law degree from Pace University in 2005, and obtained a Certificate in International Law from University College London Faculty of Laws.

This letter is an interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated 27 April 2021, in which you requested the following:

- 1. All emails, text messages, including attachments, sent and received by former Principal Deputy to the Acting Director of National Intelligence Kash Patel.
- 2. All memos, reports, briefing materials sent to and prepared for Kash Patel.

Your request is being processed in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. This response addresses the processing of 38 documents responsive to item number one of your aforementioned request (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 001016 - 001098). Upon review, nine (9) documents are being released in full (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 001017 - 001018, 001037 - 001041, 001044, 001047, 001063, 001065 - 001066, 001068). Twenty-five (25) documents are being released to you in part (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 001016, 001019, 001023 - 001036, 001042 - 001043, 001045 - 001046, 001048 - 001049, 001067, 001069 - 001082), pursuant to the following FOIA exemptions:

- (b)(3), which applies to information exempt from disclosure by statute, and, in this case, the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i) and 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m), which protect intelligence sources and methods and identifying information of ODNI personnel, respectively;
- (b)(5), which applies to information that concerns protected communications and communications within or between agencies which are protected by legal privileges;
- (b)(6), which applies to information, the release of which would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy; and
- (b)(7)(E) which would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law.

Additionally, the Department of State, the Office of Management and Budget, and the Federal Emergency Mangment Ageney withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemption

(b)(6). The National Security Council withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(5), and (b)(6). The Federal Bureau of Investigation withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), and (b)(7)(E). Exemption (b)(7)(C) pertains to information compiled for law enforcement purposes, release of which could constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of others.

We have determined that the remaining four (4) documents must be denied in full (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 001020 - 001022, 001050 - 001062, 001064), pursuant to the aforementioned FOIA exemptions.

An additional 8 documents were referred to another agency, who will respond to you directly (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 001083 – 001098).

Finally, the ODNI has processed an additional 235 pages concerning item number one of your request. Those pages were identified as responsive and sent out for consultation with other government agencies this month.

During the review process, we considered the foreseeable harm standard and have determined that the withheld information is not releasable.







Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa), chairman of the Senate Finance Committee and Ron Johnson (R-Wis.), chairman of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, sent a letter Thursday to Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Director Christopher Wray requesting all records from the FBI's Crossfire Hurricane team.

"On January 28, 2020, we wrote to Attorney General Barr and requested the declassification of four footnotes in the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) report about the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Crossfire Hurricane investigation. Since then, we received declassified versions of those and other footnotes, and they reveal disturbing facts about the FBI's investigation: the Crossfire Hurricane team's investigative file included at least two intelligence reports stating that key parts of the reporting from Christopher Steele—reporting that "played a central and essential role" in the decision to request FISA orders — were part of a Russian disinformation campaign," the senators wrote.

"The information in the now-declassified footnotes also directly contradicts statements provided by FBI officials in the OIG report. ... We are deeply troubled by the Crossfire Hurricane team's awareness of and apparent indifference to Russian disinformation, as well as by the grossly inaccurate statements by the FBI official in charge of the investigation and its supervisory intelligence analyst.

"These recently declassified footnotes raise another issue of significant concern: what other parts of the FBI's investigation were infected by Russian disinformation? ... The FBI knew that Russian intelligence was targeting Christopher Steele's company, that Steele relied on sources affiliated with Russian intelligence, and at least two of Steele's reports were described as the product of a Russian disinformation campaign. Because these facts show the intention, means, and ability to plant Russian disinformation in Steele's reporting, they suggest that the prevalence of such disinformation in the FBI's Crossfire Hurricane investigation may have been widespread."

On January 28, 2020, we wrote to Attorney General Barr and requested the declassification of four footnotes in the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) report about the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Crossfire Hurricane investigation.^[11] Since then, we received declassified versions of those and other footnotes, and they reveal disturbing facts about the FBI's investigation: the Crossfire Hurricane team's investigative file included at least two intelligence reports stating that key parts of the reporting from Christopher Steele—reporting that "played a central and essential role" in the decision to request FISA orders^[2]—were part of a Russian disinformation campaign.^[3]

The information in the now-declassified footnotes also directly contradicts statements provided by FBI officials in the OIG report. Specifically, William "Bill" Priestap, the Assistant Director for the Counterintelligence Division who was "ultimately responsible for the [Crossfire Hurricane] investigation,"^[4] told OIG that "the FBI 'didn't have any indication whatsoever' by May 2017 that the Russians were running a disinformation campaign through the Steele election reporting."^[5] The investigation's Supervisory Intelligence Analyst also told OIG that "he had no information as of June 2017 that Steele's election reporting source network had been penetrated or compromised."^[6] Yet, in January 2017, the FBI received a report that part of Steele's reporting "was part of a Russian disinformation campaign" and, in February 2017, the FBI received a second report that another part of Steele's reporting was "the product of [Russian Intelligence Services] infiltrate[ing] a source into the network."^[7] We are deeply troubled by the Crossfire Hurricane team's awareness of and apparent indifference to Russian disinformation, as well as by the grossly inaccurate

statements by the FBI official in charge of the investigation and its supervisory intelligence analyst.

These recently declassified footnotes raise another issue of significant concern: what other parts of the FBI's investigation were infected by Russian disinformation? For example, one footnote explains that Russian Intelligence Services targeted Steele's company for penetration.^[8] Another footnote shows that, as early as October 2016 and the same time it was preparing its first FISA application, the FBI became aware that one of Steele's key sources was either a Russian intelligence officer or otherwise linked to Russian intelligence.^[9] In other words, the FBI knew that Russian intelligence was targeting Christopher Steele's company, that Steele relied on sources affiliated with Russian intelligence, and at least two of Steele's reports were described as the product of a Russian disinformation campaign. Because these facts show the intention, means, and ability to plant Russian disinformation in Steele's reporting, they suggest that the prevalence of such disinformation in the FBI's Crossfire Hurricane investigation may have been widespread.

For these reasons, please provide the following no later than April 30, 2020:

- 1. All intelligence records (e.g., reporting, products, memoranda, etc.), foreign or domestic, received or reviewed by the Crossfire Hurricane team.^[10] For any such intelligence record no longer in FBI's possession, please identify the record, the entity that provided the record, and the date of FBI's review.
- 2. All FBI records (e.g., 302s, ECs, etc.) addressing these intelligence products.
- 3. A list of all intelligence records requested but not received or reviewed by the Crossfire Hurricane team.

Please send all unclassified material directly to each Committee. In keeping with the requirements of Executive Order 13526, if any of the responsive documents do contain classified information, please segregate all unclassified material within the classified documents, provide all unclassified information directly to each Committee, and provide a classified addendum to the Office of Senate Security. Although our Committees comply with all laws and regulations governing the handling of classified information, they are not bound, absent prior agreement, by any handling restrictions.

Dear Attorney General Barr:

As you are aware, the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) is ultimately responsible for the Bureau's fulsome compliance with congressional oversight requests. Since the inception of this Committee's investigations into Russian influence in the 2016 U.S. presidential election and related matters in early 2017, Committee Republicans have sent numerous requests to the FBI for documents and information. Many of these requests yielded incomplete and evasive responses that failed to include highly relevant information that now appears to have been in the FBI's possession all along.

For example, on May 16, 2017, a letter sent to Acting Director McCabe requested "[a]ny documents, records, electronically stored information including e-mail, communication, recordings, data and tangible things (including, but not limited to, graphs, charts, photographs, images and other documents) regardless of form, other than those widely available (e.g., newspaper articles) that reasonably could lead to the discovery of any facts within the [FBI investigation into Russian active measures directed at the 2016 U.S. election] publicly announced parameters."

On May 17, 2017, a letter sent to Acting Director McCabe requested the preservation and production of:

- 1. "Copies of all documents, records, electronically stored information including email, communication, recordings, data and tangible things, regardless of form, other than those widely available (e.g., newspaper articles) that reference Mr. Comey's dismissal as FBI Director, and that are potentially relevant to the Bureau's counterintelligence investigation; and
- 2. All documents memorializing conversations between the President and Mr. Comey regarding his activities as Director, to include all memoranda, notes, or other documents regarding such conversations, that are potentially relevant to the Bureau's counterintelligence investigation."

On August 24, 2017, a subpoena was served on Director Wray requiring the production of complete and unredacted copies of "any and all documents including electronic communications referring or relating to any Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) relationship UNCLASSIFIED

with former British Secret Intelligence Service officer Christopher Steele, and/or the so-called 'Trump Dossier' including, but not limited to:

- 1. Any and all FD-1023s, Contact Reports, or other documents incorporating, relying on, or referring to information provided by Mr. Steele and/or sub-sources and/or contained in the 'Trump Dossier,' and/or Fusion GPS, if they exist;
- 2. Any information, if it exists, provided by Mr. Steele as an informant/source (confidential or otherwise), or in any other capacity;
- 3. Any documents that memorialize compensation paid to, or any other benefits conferred on Mr. Steele and/or sub-sources, if they exist;
- 4. Any documents, if they exist, that memorialize FBI and/or Department of Justice (DOJ) efforts to corroborate, validate, or evaluate information provided by Mr. Steele and/or sub-sources and/or contained in the 'Trump Dossier';
- 5. Any and all documented communications, if they exist, concerning Mr. Steele or sub-sources, information provided by Mr. Steele or sub-sources, or information contained in the 'Trump Dossier,' and/or provided by Fusion GPS;
- 6. Any and all applications (including applications for renewal or extension), if they exist, for court orders submitted to the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court (FISC) pursuant to the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act (FISA) (whether or not approved by the Court) where information provided by Mr. Steele was utilized;
- 7. Any and all FISC orders issued, if they exist, based on any information provided by Mr. Steele and/or Fusion GPS; and
- 8. Any and all additional documents submitted to the FISC, including, but not limited to, pleadings and transcripts, if they exist, based on information provided by and/or created by Mr. Steele and/or Fusion GPS, if they exist."

On March 23, 2018, a letter sent to Director Wray requested unredacted copies of "all documents and communications, including emails and text messages (from any messaging applications) referring or relating to any of the following topics:

- 1. The Steele dossier, to include any and all information that supported or related to the work undertaken by Christopher Steele;
- 2. All applications for surveillance under the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act against any person affiliated with the campaign for any candidate in the 2016 U.S. presidential election, and any documents and communications pertaining to the processes related to those applications; and
- 3. All matters where the below named DOJ/FBI officials discussed, referenced, or undertook work regarding Christopher Steele, the Steele dossier, related FISA applications and the application process.
 - a. James Comey
 - b. Andrew McCabe
 - c. Peter Strzok
 - d. Lisa Page
 - e. Sally Moyer
 - f. Bill Priestap
 - g. Greg Brower
 - h. James Baker

On June 21, 2019, a letter sent to Director Wray requested the following information after previously unacknowledged information was released regarding contacts between the FBI, State Department, and Christopher Steele pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA¹):

- 1. "The date that the FBI was informed about the transmission of information from Christopher Steele to Kathleen Kavalec, including but not limited to the information now known as the Steele dossier;
- 2. All documents and communications between the State Department and the FBI related to Christopher Steele, his company Orbis, or the information Mr. Steele provided to either the State Department or the FBI;
- 3. All documents and communications provided to the FBI related to Kathleen Kavalec's relationship with Christopher Steele, including the date that the FBI was informed about the October 11, 2016 meeting, and all memoranda, notes, or other materials that the FBI received from the State Department related to that meeting;
- 4. An explanation why all materials related to Kathleen Kavalec's meetings and/or communications with Christopher Steele were not provided to the Committee in response to its August 24, 2017 subpoena.
- 5. All documents and communications related to the FBI's classification review of Kathleen Kavalec's notes and memoranda related to Christopher Steele, including but not limited to all classified and unclassified information that was not publicly released pursuant to FOIA litigation;
- 6. All documents and communications related to the FBI's redaction decisions related to notes, memoranda, and any other materials provided by the State Department; and
- 7. All documents and communications related to internal FBI discussions about whether to provide these materials to the Committee."

It is extremely concerning to see multiple instances where information that was not previously provided to this Committee pursuant to the above oversight requests appeared to have nevertheless been in the FBI's possession. Specifically, information previously withheld from this Committee has been released in reports issued by Inspector General Horowitz,² court filings,³ and has been leaked to the press.

For example, footnote 302 in IG Horowitz's December 2019 report, *Review of Four FISA Applications and Other Aspects of the FBI's Crossfire Hurricane Investigation*, discusses a document circulated among Crossfire Hurricane team members and supervisors in early October 2016, which outlined how a key Steele sub-source, referred to as "Person 1," had "historical contact with persons and entities suspected of being linked to [Russian Intelligence Services (RIS)]." The footnote continues: "The document described reporting that Person 1 'was rumored

to be a former KGB/SVR officer." This document clearly falls within the scope of the Committee's August 24, 2017 subpoena, which required the production of all documents and communications related to Steele and/or his sub-sources, to include "any and all documented communications, if they exist, concerning Mr. Steele or sub-sources, information provided by Mr. Steele or sub-sources, or information contained in the 'Trump Dossier,' and/or provided by Fusion GPS."

Footnote 302 also establishes that Glenn Simpson, the head of Fusion GPS, told senior Justice Department official Bruce Ohr that he "had assessed that Person 1 was a RIS officer who was central in connecting Trump to Russia"—and that Ohr had passed that information to a FBI special agent working on the investigation in December 2016. This communication should have been produced to the Committee in response to the March 23, 2018 request for "all matters where the below named DOJ/FBI officials discussed, referenced, or undertook work regarding Christopher Steele, the Steele dossier, related FISA applications and the application process," which specifically included Bruce Ohr.

In footnote 342, IG Horowitz revealed that the FBI received information in January 2017 indicating "that RIS may have targeted Orbis" and was also aware of a report from the intelligence community in June 2017 indicating that "two persons affiliated with RIS were aware of Steele's election investigation in early July 2016." The Committee should have been made aware of the existence of these two crucial reports, which go to the core of the parameters of the Committee's Russia investigation.

The information inappropriately withheld from this Committee is so uniformly unfavorable to the FBI that it appears the Bureau was attempting to avoid political embarrassment. There is no excuse for failing to provide this information to the Committee in a transparent and timely process.

I hope that we can return to having a productive, open, and honest oversight relationship with the Bureau. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

This response addresses the processing of documents responsive to both items of your aforementioned request (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 002953 – 003253). In response to item number one of your request, three (3) documents are being released to you in full (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-000201) 002954 – 002955, 002957 – 002958, and 002962). Additionally, eleven (11) documents are being released to you in part (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 002959 – 002961, and 002964 – 002977) pursuant to the following FOIA exemptions:

- (b)(3), which applies to information exempt from disclosure by statute, and, in this case, the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i) and 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m), which protect intelligence sources and methods and identifying information of ODNI personnel, respectively;
- (b)(5), which applies to information that concerns protected communications and communications within or between agencies which are protected by legal privileges; and
- (b)(6), which applies to information, the release of which would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

We have determined that two (2) documents must be withheld in full (Bates Pages: 21cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 002963 and 002978 – 002980) pursuant to the aforementioned FOIA exemptions.

Both the National Security Council and Department of Justice withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(5) and (b)(6). The Federal Bureau of Investigation withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), and (b)(7)(E). Exemption (b)(7)(C)

pertains to information compiled for law enforcement purposes, release of which could constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of others; and exemption (b)(7)(E) pertains to information which would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law.

In response to item number two of your request, we have determined that 272 pages must be withheld in full (Bates Pages; 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 002981 - 003253) pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and (b)(5). Exemption (b)(1) applies to information that is currently and properly classified pursuant to Executive Order 13526, Section 1.4(c).

During the review process, we considered the foreseeable harm standard and have determined that the withheld information is not releasable.

In an October 17, 2018, classified letter to then Deputy Attorney General Rosenstein, the Judiciary Committee requested answers relating to questions raised by the classified appendix to the Inspector General's report on how the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) handled the investigation of former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton titled, "A Review of Various Actions by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and Department of Justice in Advance of the 2016 Election." Having not received a meaningful response, we reiterated that request to Attorney General Barr in a letter on April 16, 2019. Today, we request that you declassify that appendix so that the American public can have a more complete understanding of what occurred during this investigation.

As we have written about publicly before, this highly classified appendix makes clear that the Obama administration's Justice Department and FBI made serious mistakes during the Clinton investigation. As explained in the unclassified version of the Inspector General's report, the classified report addresses key aspects of that investigation:

> The FBI had considered obtaining permission from the Department to review certain classified materials that may have included information potentially relevant to the Midyear investigation. Although the Midyear team drafted a memorandum to the Deputy Attorney General in late May 2016 stating that review of the highly classified materials was necessary to complete the investigation and requesting permission to access them, the FBI never sent this request to the Department.

Our paramount concern is that the classified appendix is precisely the type of information that should be made available to the American public because, otherwise, they will not know the full picture of what happened during the investigation. Unfortunately, our Democrat colleagues in Congress appear to view transparency as a one-way street. Although they seek documents and information that they believe will damage your administration, they ignore other relevant documents and information that could possibly be problematic for their political narrative—even though it would provide transparency to the American people. In order to be consistent, both parties should want the same result with respect to this investigation: the public needs to know what happened. To that end, we request that you declassify, to the fullest extent possible under Executive Order 13526, this classified appendix to the Inspector General's report on the Clinton investigation. We believe that declassification is appropriate at this time because, among other factors, the Inspector General's investigation is closed; the investigation has already been the subject of years of oversight, public hearings, and document productions; and there is a strong public interest in knowing and understanding what really transpired during the Clinton investigation. Together, these outweigh the need to further protect the information contained in the appendix.

Congress and the Executive Branch should not be the only custodians of this information – the public's business ought to be public. Declassification is consistent with the approach that you have taken with documents relating to the Russia investigation, and your call with the President of Ukraine and the related Intelligence Community complaint.

We very much appreciate your time and attention to this request.



To that end, we request that you declassify, to the fullest extent possible under Executive Order 13526, this classified appendix to the Inspector General's report on the Clinton investigation. We believe that declassification is appropriate at this time because, among other factors, the Inspector General's investigation is closed; the investigation has already been the subject of years of oversight, public hearings, and document productions; and there is a strong public interest in knowing and understanding what really transpired during the Clinton investigation. Together, these outweigh the need to further protect the information contained in the appendix.

Congress and the Executive Branch should not be the only custodians of this information – the public's business ought to be public. Declassification is consistent with the approach that you have taken with documents relating to the Russia investigation, and your call with the President of Ukraine and the related Intelligence Community complaint.

We very much appreciate your time and attention to this request.



Dear Ambassador Grenell:

On December 30, 2016, the Intelligence Community produced an assessment titled, "Assessing Russian Activities and Intentions in Recent US Elections" (Assessment).¹ The Assessment contained classified annexes² that provided greater detail into the Intelligence Community's process in producing the Assessment and "full supporting information on key elements of the influence campaign."³ At the insistence of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), a summary of the reporting created by Christopher Steele was included in Annex A.⁴ A declassified version of the Assessment was made available on January 6, 2017.⁵

On March 22, 2018, the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI) produced its report that, in part, analyzed the Assessment titled, "Report on Russian Active Measures." A declassified version of this report has not been made public.

In light of the continuing public interest in the Intelligence Community's Assessment, we request that the classified annexes to the Assessment and the HSPCI report be declassified to the fullest extent possible.


- Which specific FISA authority was used,

As stated in E.O. 13526, some level of damage must be identified for information to reach the threshold for classification. The DNI considers this issue to be closed. Thanks!





This letter is an interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated 27 April 2021, in which you requested the following:

- 1. All emails, text messages, including attachments, sent and received by former Principal Deputy to the Acting Director of National Intelligence Kash Patel.
- 2. All memos, reports, briefing materials sent to and prepared for Kash Patel.

Your request was being processed in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. This response addresses the processing of 12 documents responsive to item number one of your aforementioned request. Upon review, we have determined that two (2) of those documents are being release to you in full (Bates pages 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000120 – 000121, 000123 – 000125). Further, ten (10) documents are being released to you in part (Bates pages 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000104 – 000119, 000122) pursuant to the following FOIA exemptions:

- (b)(3), which applies to information exempt from disclosure by statute, and, in this case, specifically the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, statue 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m), which protects identifying information of ODNI personnel;
- (b)(6), which applies to information, the release of which would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

The Department of Treasury, the Department of Justice, and the Department of Homeland Security each withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(6). The Federal Bureau of Investigations withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), and (b)(7)(E):

- (b)(7)(C) applies to information compiled for law enforcement purposes which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
- (b)(7)(E) applies to information compiled for law enforcement purposes which would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations.







Mr. President, since June of 2018, I have objected to the nomination of William R. Evanina to be Director of the National Counterintelligence and Security Center (PN192). Today, due to the recent actions by the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) and the Attorney General to finally respond to my very longstanding oversight requests, I withdraw my objection to Mr. Evanina's nomination.

When I noticed my intention to object to this nominee in June of 2018, I made it very clear to the public and to the administration my reasons for doing so. I did not question Mr. Evanina's credentials in any way, and I put my statement of those reasons in the Record. I have done that consistently, not only since the rules of the Senate first required every Member to do that but even before that rule was put in place.

At the time, I experienced difficulties obtaining relevant documents and briefings from the Justice Department and ODNI related to the 2016 election controversies. On several occasions, then-Deputy Attorney General (DAG) Rod Rosenstein personally assured me that the Senate Judiciary Committee, of which I was Chairman, would receive equal access to information provided to the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI) with regard to any concessions in its negotiations regarding pending subpoenas from that Committee. However, I, and the Judiciary Committee, never received equal access from DAG Rosenstein.

For example, on August 7, 2018, I <u>wrote</u> to the Justice Department and pointed out that the House Intelligence Committee had received documents related to Bruce Ohr that the Judiciary Committee had not received. The Department initially denied those records had been provided to the House Intelligence Committee. After my staff confronted the Department, we eventually received some Bruce Ohr documents. In that same 2018 letter, I also asked for other documents based on my equal access agreement with DAG Rosenstein.

I then learned that the Justice Department took the position that then-ODNI Director Dan Coats prohibited the Department from sharing the requested records with the Committee. Needless to say, it was your typical bureaucratic blame-game.

Then, some personnel changes took place. I voiced my concerns to Acting Director Grenell and Attorney General Barr. Recently, thanks to their commitment to transparency, I have received access to the types of documents that I asked for almost two years ago in June 2018. Moreover, both Acting Director Grenell and Attorney General Barr have gone multiple steps further by declassifying much of the information that I had sought access to. Credit should be given when it is due and Acting Director Grenell and Attorney General Barr deserve that credit here today.

If their predecessors had simply respected legitimate congressional oversight and their agreements with me and the Judiciary Committee from the beginning, Mr. Evanina would have been confirmed long ago.

Now, I also want to remind everyone, especially future administrations, that the Senate Judiciary Committee's jurisdiction extends to the Intelligence Community. In the authorizing resolution that created the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, the Senate explicitly reserved for other standing committees, such as the Senate Judiciary Committee, independent authority to "study and review any intelligence activity" and "to obtain full and prompt access to the product of the intelligence activities of any department or agency" when such activity "directly affects a matter otherwise within the jurisdiction of such committee" (S. Res. 400). The Senate Judiciary Committee has jurisdiction over all federal courts, including the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court (FISC). As I understand it, the records at issue here fall into that category.

Let this also be a reminder that when it comes to congressional oversight, I will use all the tools at my disposal to get to the truth of the matter and get access to the records that I believe are necessary to advance my investigations. The Executive Branch must recognize that it has an ongoing obligation to respond to Congressional inquiries in a timely and reasonable manner. As I've said many times before, transparency brings accountability and congressional oversight helps to bring about the sunlight necessary for that to happen.

Dear Ambassador Grenell and Attorney General Barr.

As you are aware, on May 13, 2020, the Office of the Director of National Intelligence released a list of the identity of any official who submitted a request to the National Security Agency at any point between November 8, 2016, and January 31, 2017, to unmask the identity of former National Security Advisor, Lieutenant General Michael T. Flynn (Ref.). That list contained the identities of 39 officials who made requests to unmask General Flynn's identity.

Given the extensive number of requests for the unmasking of General Flynn's name during this short time period, it raises the question of whether these or other officials sought the unmasking of the identities of other individuals associated with the Trump campaign or transition team. Accordingly, I request that the Committee be provided with a list of the names of any officials who requested, between November 8, 2016, and January 31, 2017, to unmask the identities of those associated with the Trump campaign or transition team, including but not limited to Donald Trump, Donald Trump, Jr., Ivanka Trump, Jared Kushner, Corey Lewandowski, Paul Manafort, Steve Bannon, Kellyanne Conway, Sam Clovis, Chris Christie, Carter Page, and George Papadopoulos, and the reason given for any such request. In addition, I request an explanation as to why the list released on May 13th did not contain a record showing who unmasked General Flynn's identity for his phone call with Ambassador Kislyak.

Dear Ambassador Grenell and Attorney General Barr:

Based on recent press reports, it is our understanding that you conducted a classification review and declassified information related to numerous requests to "unmask" the names of U.S. persons who appeared in certain intelligence reporting around the time of the 2016 election through January 2017.

We wholeheartedly agree that transparency is needed more now than ever. One of the most significant unanswered questions about what occurred during the 2016 election is how many Americans were "unmasked," at whose request, and for what purpose.¹ Your recent decision to declassify dozens of footnotes from the report of the Department of Justice's Office of the Inspector General about the investigation of the Trump campaign;² the declassification and disclosure of transcripts of related interviews by the House Intelligence Committee; and the disclosure of exculpatory information related to the prosecution of Lt. General Michael Flynn, paint a more and more troubling picture of the conduct that we have been investigating since 2017. However, we firmly believe that the best way to resolve these issues is to determine the truth, and to make clear to the American people what did and did not occur.

For these reasons, we respectfully request that you make available to us, as soon as possible, all information regarding the "unmasking" of U.S. persons requested by members of President Obama's administration around the time of the 2016 election through January 2017.



On January 28, 2020, we wrote to Attorney General Barr and requested the declassification of four footnotes in the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) report about the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Crossfire Hurricane investigation.¹ Since then, we received declassified versions of those and other footnotes, and they reveal disturbing facts about the FBI's investigation: the Crossfire Hurricane team's investigative file included at least two intelligence reports stating that key parts of the reporting from Christopher Steele—reporting that "played a central and essential role" in the decision to request FISA orders²—were part of a Russian disinformation campaign.³

The information in the now-declassified footnotes also directly contradicts statements provided by FBI officials in the OIG report. Specifically, William "Bill" Priestap, the Assistant Director for the Counterintelligence Division who was "ultimately responsible for the [Crossfire Hurricane] investigation,"⁴ told OIG that "the FBI 'didn't have any indication whatsoever' by May 2017 that the Russians were running a disinformation campaign through the Steele election reporting."⁵ The investigation's Supervisory Intelligence Analyst also told OIG that "he had no information as of June 2017 that Steele's election reporting source network had been penetrated or compromised."⁶ Yet, in January 2017, the FBI received a report that part of Steele's reporting "was part of a Russian disinformation campaign" and, in February 2017, the FBI received a second report that another part of Steele's reporting was "the product of [Russian Intelligence Services] infiltrate[ing] a source into the network."⁷ We are deeply troubled by the Crossfire Hurricane team's awareness of and apparent indifference to Russian disinformation, as well as by the grossly inaccurate statements by the FBI official in charge of the investigation and its supervisory intelligence analyst.

These recently declassified footnotes raise another issue of significant concern: what other parts of the FBI's investigation were infected by Russian disinformation? For example, one footnote explains that Russian Intelligence Services targeted Steele's company for penetration.⁸ Another footnote shows that, as early as October 2016 and the same time it was preparing its first FISA application, the FBI became aware that one of Steele's key sources was either a Russian intelligence officer or otherwise linked to Russian intelligence.⁹ In other words, the FBI knew that Russian intelligence was targeting Christopher Steele's company, that Steele relied on sources affiliated with Russian intelligence, and at least two of Steele's reports were described as the product of a Russian disinformation campaign. Because these facts show the intention, means, and ability to plant Russian disinformation in Steele's reporting, they suggest that the prevalence of such disinformation in the FBI's Crossfire Hurricane investigation may have been widespread.

For these reasons, please provide the following no later than April 30, 2020:

- 1. All intelligence records (*e.g.*, reporting, products, memoranda, *etc.*), foreign or domestic, received or reviewed by the Crossfire Hurricane team.¹⁰ For any such intelligence record no longer in FBI's possession, please identify the record, the entity that provided the record, and the date of FBI's review.
- 2. All FBI records (e.g., 302s, ECs, etc.) addressing these intelligence products;
- 3. A list of all intelligence records requested but not received or reviewed by the Crossfire Hurricane team.

Please send all unclassified material directly to each Committee. In keeping with the requirements of Executive Order 13526, if any of the responsive documents do contain classified information, please segregate all unclassified material within the classified documents, provide all unclassified information directly to each Committee, and provide a classified addendum to the Office of Senate Security. Although our Committees comply with all laws and regulations governing the handling of classified information, they are not bound, absent prior agreement, by any handling restrictions.

This letter is an interim response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated 27 April 2021, in which you requested the following:

- 2. All memos, reports, briefing materials sent to and prepared for Kash Patel.

Your request is being processed in accordance with the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. This response addresses the processing of 77 documents responsive to item number one of your aforementioned request (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000749 - 000945). Upon review, we have determined that five (5) of those documents may be released to you in full (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000917 - 000919, 000926 - 000928, 000936 - 000937, 000941 - 000942). Additionally, 17 of those documents are being released to you in part (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000912 - 000916, 000920 - 000925, 000929 - 000935, 000938 - 000940, and 000943 - 000945) pursuant to the following FOIA exemptions:

- (b)(3), which applies to information exempt from disclosure by statute, and, in this case, specifically the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m), which protects identifying information of ODNI personnel;
- (b)(6), which applies to information, the release of which would clearly constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

The National Security Council also withheld information pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(5) and (b)(6). FOIA exemption (b)(5) applies to information that concerns communications within or between agencies that is protected by legal privileges.

An additional 55 documents were referred to another agency, who will respond to you directly (Bates Pages: 21-cv-02874 (DF-2021-00201) 000749 – 000911).

Finally, the ODNI has processed an additional 123 pages concerning item number one of your request. Those pages were identified as responsive and sent out for consultation with other government agencies this month.





Dear President Trump:

According to reports, on Friday, April 3, you placed Intelligence Community Inspector General (IC IG) Michael Atkinson on administrative leave for thirty days pending his removal from office.¹ As you know, Congress created inspectors general to combat waste, fraud, and abuse, and to be independent watchdogs holding federal agencies accountable to the taxpayer. Congress established the IC IG, "to initiate and conduct independent investigations, inspections, audits, and reviews on programs and activities within the responsibility and authority of the Director of National Intelligence."² Further, the IC IG and indeed all inspectors general (IG) are designed to fulfill a dual role, reporting to both the President and Congress, to secure efficient, robust, and independent agency oversight. To ensure inspectors general are fully capable of performing their critical duties, and in recognition of their importance both to efficient administration and to the legislative function, Congress set clear, statutory notice requirements for their potential removal.

Specifically, current law requires that you inform the Senate and House Intelligence Committees in writing of the reasons for your removal of the IC IG, at least 30 days prior to that removal.³ However, in your recent letter to the Senate Intelligence Committee, you stated only that, "it is vital that [you] have the fullest confidence" in those serving as IGs and that "this is no longer the case" with regard to Mr. Atkinson.⁴ Further, according to public reports, Mr. Atkinson already was placed on administrative leave, effectively removing him from his position prior to the completion of the statutorily required notice period.⁵

Congressional intent is clear that an expression of lost confidence, without further explanation, is not sufficient to fulfill the requirements of the statute. This is in large part because Congress intended that inspectors general only be removed when there is clear evidence of

wrongdoing or failure to perform the duties of the office, and not for reasons unrelated to their performance, to help preserve IG independence.⁶ The Senate Committee Report on the Inspector General Reform Act of 2008 provides further clarity regarding the high bar that is expected in cases of removal. In that report, the Committee expressed its intent that, "Inspectors General who fail to perform their duties properly whether through malfeasance or nonfeasance, or whose personal actions bring discredit upon the office, be removed." The report also states that, "[t]he requirement to notify the Congress in advance of the reasons for the removal should serve to ensure that Inspectors General are not removed for political reasons."⁷

In 2009, senators of both parties raised similar concerns when the Obama administration removed the IG of the Corporation for National and Community Service, Gerald Walpin, by placing him on administrative leave for 30 days without consulting members of Congress.⁸ Like the present notice at issue here, the initial notice of removal for IG Walpin only vaguely noted the President no longer had "the fullest confidence" in him.⁹ At that time, the senators affirmed Congress's intent that any notice of removal should clearly outline specific reasons supporting that decision. The senators also reiterated the purpose for the 30 day notice to Congress: to provide an opportunity for an appropriate dialogue with Congress in the event that the planned transfer or removal is viewed as an inappropriate or politically motivated attempt to terminate an effective inspector general. By placing the IG on 30 days of administrative leave and naming an acting replacement, the administration has already effectively removed that IG and appears to have circumvented Congress's role in this process.¹⁰

As supporters of the Inspector General community, and as advocates for government transparency and accountability, it is our responsibility to confirm that there are clear, substantial reasons for removal. To that end, we ask that you provide more detailed reasoning for the removal of Inspector General Atkinson no later than April 13, 2020. Please also provide your views on how the appointment of an acting official prior to the end of the 30 day notice period comports with statutory requirements.







The COVID-19 antibody blood draw is being administered voluntarily for White House complex surveillance and only to determine if you have been exposed to the virus that causes COVID-19. Your negative result could be because you have never been infected by this virus, or that you had COVID-19 but that there has not been enough time since the infection to develop antibodies.

What will be learned by this test?

We would like to know what percentage of tested individuals have evidence of prior exposure to the virus that causes COVID-19.

What cannot be answered by this test?

This test will not indicate whether any staff are protected from COVID-19. It will not indicate whether any person can return to work.

Dear Acting Director Grenell:

Recent media reporting has discussed the existence of Presidential Emergency Action Documents (PEADs), described as classified documents created by the Executive Branch that include draft proclamations, executive orders, and proposals for legislation to be deployed during an emergency. As reported, no PEADs appear to have ever been invoked, but past documents have purportedly contemplated the suspension of habeas corpus, the detention of U.S. citizens without requisite suspicion of criminal activity, the execution of warrantless searches and seizures, and the imposition of martial law, all of which would raise significant constitutional concerns if implemented.

The President has declared an emergency in light of the coronavirus. In addition, Title 50, U.S. Code, Section 3312 requires that the Director of National Intelligence submit to the congressional intelligence committees any "covered policy document," which is defined to include any presidential directive or other document that "assigns tasks, roles, or responsibilities to the intelligence community or an element of the intelligence community." However, the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence has not been advised of the existence or substance of any current PEADs, including any PEADs that relate to the Intelligence Community or require classification due to urgent national security concerns.

In our democratic system, emergency powers not expressly enumerated in the Constitution are only available to a president pursuant to statutory authorization by Congress, and these authorities and their exercise are subject to scrutiny by the Courts. If these emergency powers are being contemplated, they should be transparent and made available for Congressional oversight. Accordingly, we request that, at the soonest possible date, you or a designated senior staff member produce to and brief the Committee on the existence and substance of any such PEADs, or, if none exist, that you so state, in accordance with your obligation to keep the Committee fully informed.





Mr. President,

We write to urge you to withdraw the United States from the Open Skies Treaty (OST). On March 4 Secretary of Defense Mark Esper testified to the Senate Armed Services Committee that the Defense Department had indefinitely halted recapitalization of the OC-135B observation airplanes that the United States Air Force flies in support of the OST, pending a decision by the administration regarding future participation in the treaty. We call on you to end that participation.

These aircraft are set to undergo millions of dollars in upgrade costs, and then soon afterwards the cost of participation will go from several million dollars to several hundred million dollars because they will have to be replaced. These costs pose an unnecessary burden on our military budgets and on American taxpayers, and would alone justify withdrawing from the treaty.

Of course, the costs of the OST go far beyond wasteful spending, and directly erode our national security by enabling Russian espionage over the United States. The Russians have installed advanced digital technology to enhance those capabilities, and they overfly major and sensitive American cities and infrastructure, including Washington DC and New York City. As Lieutenant General Vincent R. Stewart, then-Director of the Defense Intelligence Agency, testified to Congress in 2016, the OST "allows Russia… to get incredible foundational intelligence on critical infrastructure, bases, ports, [and] all of our facilities" which "gives them a significant advantage." In the same year Adm. Cecil Haney, then-commander of U.S. STRATCOM, testified that "given the lack of overhead capability that the Russians have, Open Skies gives them a capability to be able to reconnoiter parts of our country and other nations."

The Russians have even used their privileges under OST to directly target you. In the summer of 2017, they flew their Tupolev Tu-154M spy plane over Bedminster, NJ while you were there, flying at 4,000 feet near your residence. The area is, of course and importantly, subject to Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR). The Russians were permitted to fly through the TFR because of the OST.

The benefits to the United States, meanwhile, are marginal. Even under conditions of good faith Russian implementation, the treaty is at best unnecessary and at worst a threat, since the U.S. does not gain additional intelligence beyond our far more advanced capabilities, while the Russians use their flights to gain a view of the homeland that is otherwise inaccessible to them. The Russians however are not implementing the treaty in good faith, and deny the United States

overflight rights. As Secretary Esper testified, the Russians "have been cheating for many years."

As Lieutenant General Stewart already told Congress in 2015, "[t]he Open Skies construct was designed for a different era." It is well past time to withdraw from it.



Before joining the NSC, Mr. Patel served as the National Security Advisor and Senior Counsel for the House Permanent Select Committee (HPSCI) on Intelligence, where he spearheaded the investigation into the Russian active measures campaign to influence the 2016 presidential election. Concurrently, Mr. Patel oversaw sensitive programs for the Intelligence and Special Forces communities, visiting dozens of installations around the world.

He joined HPSCI after his time as a terrorism prosecutor at the Department of Justice (DOJ), leading investigations and prosecutions of Al-Qa'ida, ISIS, and many other terrorists groups. His work spanned numerous continents and across the U.S. Mr. Patel then served as the DOJ Liaison Officer to Joint Special Operation Command (JSOC). At JSOC, he worked with the U.S. Military's tier 1 special forces to conduct global targeting operations against the world's leading terrorists.

Mr. Patel's began his career as a public defender, trying scores of jury trials in state and federal courts ranging from murder to narco-trafficking to fraud.

A native of New York, Mr. Patel now lives in Washington, D.C. He completed his undergraduate studies at the University of Richmond in 2002, returned to New York to earn his law degree in 2005, and obtained a Certificate in International Law from University College London Faculty of Laws in the United Kingdom.





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

On January 5, following a briefing by IC leadership on Russian hacking during the 2016 Presidential election, President Obama had a brief follow-on conversation with FBI Director Jim Comey and Deputy Attorney General Sally Yates in the Oval Office. Vice President Biden and I were also present.

President Obama began the conversation by stressing his continued commitment to ensuring that every aspect of this issue is handled by the Intelligence and law enforcement communities "by the book". The President stressed that he is not asking about, initiating or instructing anything from a law enforcement perspective. He reiterated that our law enforcement team needs to proceed as it normally would by the book.

From a national security perspective, however, President Obama said he wants to be sure that, as we engage with the incoming team, we are mindful to ascertain if there is any reason that we cannot share information fully as it relates to Russia.

Director Comey affirmed that he is proceeding "by the book" as it relates to law enforcement. From a national security perspective, Comey said he does have some concerns that incoming NSA Flynn is speaking frequently with Russian Ambassador Kislyak. Comey said that could be an issue as it relates to sharing sensitive information. President Obama asked if Comey was saying that the NSC should not pass sensitive information related to Russia to Flynn. Comey replied "potentially." He added that he has no indication thus far that Flynn has passed classified information to Kislyak, but he noted that "the level of communication is unusual."

The President asked Comey to inform him if anything changes in the next few weeks that should affect how we share classified information with the incoming team. Comey said he would.
