The FBI has completed its review of records subject to the Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) that are responsive to your request. FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) Requests for Records about any Individual—Witness Security Program Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could identify any participant in the Witness Security Program pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(3), 18 U.S.C. 3521, and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.
- (iii) Requests for Confidential Informant Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of confidential informant records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F) [5 U.S.C.§ § 552 (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F)] and Privacy Act exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C.§ 552a (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records would reveal confidential informant identities and information, expose law enforcement techniques, and endanger the life or physical safety of individuals. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

Part 3: General Information:

- (i) Record Searches and Standard Search Policy. The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching systems, such as the Central Records System (CRS), or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. The CRS is an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled by the FBI per its law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization, comprising records of FBI Headquarters, FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide; Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records are included in the CRS. The standard search policy is a search for main entity records in the CRS. Unless specifically requested, a standard search does not include a search for reference entity records or administrative records of previous FOIPA requests.
 - a. Main Entity Records created for individuals or non-individuals who are the subjects or the focus of an investigation
 - b. Reference Entity Records- created for individuals or non-individuals who are associated with a case but are not known subjects or the focus of an investigation
- (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Foreseable Harm Standard.** As amended in 2016, the Freedom of Information Act provides that a federal agency may withhold responsive records only if: (1) the agency reasonably foresees that disclosure would harm an interest protected by one of the nine exemptions that FOIA enumerates, or (2) disclosure is prohibited by law (5 United States Code, Section 552(a)(8)(A)(i)). The FBI considers this foreseeable harm standard in the processing of its requests.
- (iv) Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence:
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

May 11, 1972

Source one advised on May 11, 1972, that the demonstration by students of the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA), Los Angeles, California, which occurred on May 11, 1972, was a protest of President Richard M. Nixon's actions concerning the mining of North Vietnamese harbors and the increased aerial bombardment of strategic supply routes of the North Vietnamese army.

At 8:00 a.m. on May 11, 1972, officials at the UCLA campus ordered the UCLA campus police to clear Murphy Hall, UCLA Administration Building, of 60 demonstrators who had occupied it since 12:30 p.m. on May 10, 1972, and had remained in the building throughout the night. By 9:00 a.m. Murphy Hall was cleared of demonstrators. The building sustained minor property damage as a result of the occupation.

Once outside of Murphy Hall the demonstrators barricaded the main entrance to the building.

At 11:10 a.m. the UCLA campus police requested demonstrators to remove the barricade from the building entrance. The demonstrators fully complied with the UCLA campus police instructions, but remained outside of Murphy Hall.

At twelve noon approximately two thousand demonstrators gathered at Janss Steps, a free speech area at UCLA, for a rally that was organized under the auspices

of the Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (SMC) and Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) where numerous members of the crowd spoke in protest of President Richard M. Nixon's recent actions against North Vietnam.

SDS was founded during June 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960s functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the U.S. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy," SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position, with debate centering on how best to create a revolutionary youth movement. Internal factionalism produced a split during the SDS National Convention in June 1969, which resulted in the following three factions: Weatherman; Worker Student Alliance (WSA); and Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM). The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated with SDS. The WSA continues to use the name SDS and maintains its national headquarters in Chicago, Illinois.

Weatherman, formerly a faction of Students for a Democratic Society, controlled the SDS National Office from June 1969 until its closing in February 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

WSA, a faction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Boston, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and in February 1971, moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash. Its official publication, "New Left Notes," is published in Chicago.

The Progressive Labor Party was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese Communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and MAO Tse-tung thought.

The RYM, a pro-communist revolutionary youth organization, was organized in 1969, first as a faction within the Students For A Democratic Society, then as a separate group with head-quarters in Atlanta, Georgia. RYM was unsuccessful in attracting support and by mid-1970 it was practically defunct.

The gathering at Janss Steps was a group whose composition was equally divided as to males and females, 85 percent Caucasian with 95 percent of the participants of high school and college age.

At 12:50 p.m. the rally at Janss Steps ended with a group of one thousand demonstrators returning to Murphy Hall. Two hundred demonstrators separated from the primary group and commandeered four UCLA-owned three-wheeled Cushman motor vehicles and used these vehicles with other debris to blockade all entrances to Murphy Hall. The

blockades were doused by the demonstrators with gasoline obtained from the Cushman motor vehicles. The gasoline was not ignited.

Officials at UCLA requested Los Angeles Police Department assistance in dispersing the demonstrators. At 2:20 p.m., the demonstration was declared an illegal assembly by the Los Angeles Police Department and was to be dispersed within ten minutes. At 2:34 p.m. the Los Angeles Police Department and the UCLA campus police conducted tactical sweeps to disperse the demonstrators. At 3:30 p.m., the first Los Angeles Police Department bus load of arrestees departed the UCLA campus bound for the Los Angeles Police Department mobile command booking station. Fifty-two demonstrators, consisting of both males and females were arrested, including Bill Walton, All American center, UCLA basketball team. Also during the course of the demonstration numerous trash receptacles were set on fire by the demonstrators.

By 4:00 p.m. on May 11, 1972, the demonstration had ceased and order was restored to the UCLA campus.

The aforementioned demonstration was observed by Special Agents of the FBI.

Source one advised the following individuals were arrested by the Los Angeles Police Department for violation, Section 409 Penal Code, failure to disperse from an unlawful assembly, on May 11, 1972:





THE STATEMENT CLAIMS THAT THEY WERE FOLLOWED BY AT LEAST EIGHT ARMED FBI AGENTS ONE MONTH AGO AND WERE AFRAID THEY WERE GOING TO BE KILLED, AND WHEN THEY DISCOVERED FBI WAS NO LONGER WITH THEM, THEY CAREFULLY AVOIDED BEING FOUND. STATEMENT CLAIMS THAT FBI MADE UP STORY ALLEGING THAT THEY HAD ESCAPED FROM AN FBI TAIL IN HIGH-SPEED CHASE THROUGH THE STREETS OF BERKELEY, CALIFORNIA. STATEMENT CLAIMS THIS JEOPARDIZED THEIR LIVES BY HELPING SET THE STAGE FOR A POSSIBLE VIOLENT CONFRONTATION. STATEMENT CLAIMS THAT THE FBI BEGAN HARASSING THEIR FRIENDS AND RELATIVES TO FORCE THEM INTO THE OPEN AND TO END THIS HARASSMENT, THEY DECIDED TO SURFACE AND APPEAR AT THIS PRESS CONFERENCE SO THE MEDIA COULD HEAR FROM THEM

DIRECTLY, FREE FROM THE DISTORTIONS OF THE FBI. THE STATEMENT CLAIMS THAT THEY ARE NOT FUGITIVES AND ARE PREPARED TO PRESENT THEMSELVES TO THE GOVERNMENT THE MOMENT THEY ARE REQUIRED TO DO SO. ADDING THAT THE FBI KNOWS THIS BECAUSE THEIR LAWYERS HAVE BEEN IN TOUCH WITH THE FBI THREE TIMES IN THEPAST MONTH AT WHICH TIME THEY TOLD THE FBI THEY HAVE NO THOSE OF TALKING TO FBI AGENTS. (THIS IS NOT CORRECT INASMUCH AS THE SAN FRANCISCO OFFICE HAS YET TO DISCOVER WHAT LAWYER REPRESENTS JACK AND SAN FRANCISCO OFFICE HAS NOT BEEN CONTACTED BY ANY ATTORNEY REGARDING JACK WHEREABOUTS OR INTERVIEWING THEM.) STATEMENT CONTINUES THAT THEIR ACTIONS IN THE PAST YEAR ARE COMPLETELY DEFENSIBLE AND THAT THEY FIND THE SENSELESS KILLING OF MARCUS FOSTER TO BE MORALLY AND POLITICALLY INTOLERABLE, BUT NO MORE SO THAN THE EXECUTION WITHOUT TRIAL LAST MAY OF SIX ALLEGED MEMBERS OF THE SYMBIONESE LIBERATION ARMY (SLA) IN LOS ANGELES.



Walton advised that he met Jack Scott in the mid 1970s and later became his roommate. Walton advised that at first he knew nothing about Scott's dealings with the Simbionese Liberation Army, (SLA). He further advised that he did not know anything about Scott's involvement until after he was under suspicion for being involved with the SLA. Walton advised the interviewing agents that the time was very different and that the FBI was very different. He suspected that the FBI was monitoring his telephone calls during the initial part of the investigation because of his association with Scott.

Walton advised that Scott told him after he had already been questioned the first time by the FBI of his involvement with the SLA. Scott explained to Walton that he was telephoned one night after the Patty Hearst kidnaping by some members of the SLA. He was summoned to a residence near the Berkley University campus. Scott drove to the area and entered the residence. When he entered, he saw Patty Hearst and some other members of the SLA. Scott told Walton that he did not tell him prior to that time because he did not want to involve him in the investigation.

In the late 1970s, Walton and Scott parted ways because of issues which did not relate to the investigation. Walton did not see Scott again, but recently heard that he was terminally ill. Walton planned to visit Scott in the hospital and had travel plans already set up. He spoke to him on the telephone telling him of his intentions to visit, but Scott died on a Sunday evening. Walton had planned to visit Scott the following Tuesday. Walton advised that Scott never said anything about the SLA after they spoke about it in the 1970's.

Walton advised that he has already been interviewed twice by the FBI in relation to the case. The first time he was interviewed was in Cleveland, Ohio, which is where he was for a

Details: On December 21, 2000, Bill Walton was interviewed at his residence in San Diego, California. Walton was interviewed regarding his knowledge of whereabouts. Walton stated that he never knew nor He further relayed the story of how he came to know about Jack Scott's involvement in harboring members of the Simbionese Liberation Army, (SLA).

Walton was cooperative throughout the interview, and appeared to be very cordial. He relayed the history of his suspected involvement with the SLA, and the resulting investigation headed by the FBI. Walton briefly discussed his first two contacts with the FBI regarding the matter.

Though the lead was initially sent to San Diego in April 2000, Walton could not be interviewed until recently because of his schedule which included residing in Australia until the year 2000 Holiday Season. The results of the interview are documented in the enclosed 302.

Bill Walton was the NBA's Most Valuable Player, 1978; all-NBA First Team, 1978; NBA All-StarTeam, 1977 and 1978; NBA Playoff's MVP, 1977; all-NBA second team, 1977; winner of the NBA Sixth Man Award, 1986. Walton is the first of only two players in the history of the NBA to lead the league in both blocked shots and rebounding in the same season.

He remains active in basketball through clinics, camps, coaching, and television commentary. He started his broadcasting career in 1990 as an analyst for Prime Ticket and the Dallas Mavericks. Walton worked for CBS sports during the NCAA Final Four and for NBC during the 1996 Summer Olympic Games. Currently he is working for the Los Angeles Clippers, UCLA, Fox Networks' Pac 10, NCAA & NBA Coverage, and the NBA on NBC.

Walton received the 1991 NBPA's Oscar Robertson Leadership Award. In 1992, 1993, 1995 and 1996 the Southern California, Sports Broadcasters Association honored Walton the the Best Television Analyst/Commentator award. And in 1993, Walton was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts. Walton also became a member of the GTE Academic All American Hall of Fame during the spring of 1994. For his television broadcasting work in 1995 and 1996, Walton was nominated for an Emmy award. In 1997 Walton was selected as one of the NBA's fifty best players of all time. Also in 1997, Walton was inducted into the National High School Sports Hall of Fame, making him the first male basketball player to be so honored from the state of California. The NCAA honored Walton with their Silver Anniversary Award in 1999 for having made significant professional and civic contributions since he completed his intercollegiate eligibility 25 years ago.

In 1979 Walton received an Emmy for his work on an environmental documentary filmed on location in the Philippines. He has also had roles in feature films such as: He's Got Game, Forget Paris, Celtic Pride and Ghost Busters. And he is a regular contributor to television shows including The Wheel of Fortune, The Jeff Foxworthy Show, The Sentinel, and Pacific Blues. His commercials include: Reebok, Anacin, Best Western Hotels.





William Theodore Waffon, III (Bill) was born on November 5th, 1952, in San Diego, California. - プロレルタイカン

He was introduced to the game of basketball while in the fourth grade at Blessed Sacrament Elementary School by coach Frank "Rocky" Graciano. Walton then attended Helix High School, where the basketball coach was Gordon Nash. At Helix, his team won the California Interscholastic Federation High School title two years in a row, while winning their final 49 consecutive games.

Walton enrolled at UCLA in 1970. He played center for John Wooden's Varsity team for three seasons (1972-1974), after a year with the freshman team in 1971. He was a member of two NCAA championship teams compiling an NCAA record 88 consecutive game winning streak.



Bill Walton is a three-time recipient of the UCLA MVP Award, the NCAA Player of the Year Award, All-American College Player Award in 1972, 1973, 1974, and winner of the Sullivan Award for the Best Amateur Athlete of 1973. He was named to the Pacific 8 All-Conference first team and was player of the year for three consecutive years. At UCLA Walton was a scholar-athlete who also earned Academic All-American honors three years in a row. He graduated with honors with a B.A. in history.

Walton's professional career began when he was the number one over all pick in the 1974 NBA Draft by the Portland Trailblazers. He was a member of their championship team in 1977. Nine years

later he earned another championship title, this time with the Boston Celtics in 1986. He played with the Trailblazers 1974-1979, the San Diego Clippers 1979-1984, the relocated Los Angeles Clippers in 1985, and The Boston Celtics 1985-1988.
