

Bloomberg Politics – Purple Slice Poll College Educated Voters Conducted by Purple Strategies Survey Topline July 2016

METHODOLOGY

Purple Insights conducted 653 interviews of college educated likely voters nationwide between July 7 and 10, 2016. The poll was conducted online, using an opt-in nationally representative panel. The margin of error is +/-3.8 percentage points and higher for subgroups.

Trump University has been accused in multiple lawsuits of defrauding thousands of students out of millions of dollars, and one of those cases is going to trial this year.	56
Trump opposes raising the federal minimum wage. He has said wages are too high and it will make us less competitive.	39
Trump hasn't released his tax returns, and if he doesn't release them before the election, he would break with 40 years of precedent.	50
Trump's tax plan would spend three trillion dollars on tax cuts over 10 years for people like him who make over a million dollars.	58
Trump has called women names like "pigs," "dogs," "slobs," and "disgusting." He's called Fox News' Megyn Kelly a "bimbo" and a "lightweight," insulted Carly Fiorina's and Heidi Cruz's appearance and has made lewd comments about other women.	69
Trump has said that Mexican immigrants are "bringing drugs, they're bringing crime, they're rapists." He says that he will create a deportation force to remove 11 million undocumented immigrants from the US in two years, which even Republican economists estimate would cost 1 trillion dollars.	56

The FBI director determined that Hillary Clinton and her staff were "extremely careless in their handling of very sensitive, highly classified information" on her private e-mail server.	47
Critics say that Clinton is totally controlled by Wall Street – they have paid her hundreds of thousands of dollars for speeches, and she'll do what they say if she becomes president.	43
Some have accused Clinton of standing by and enabling her husband's infidelity while he was in office, and of going after those women.	28
Opponents say that Clinton lied about the cause of the Benghazi attacks, after failing to protect the US Ambassador and other embassy workers there.	44
Critics say that Clinton's decisions as Secretary of State helped allow ISIS to form and grow out of control.	42
Clinton has in the past supported free trade agreements that opponents say have ripped off America and exported our jobs.	34
