Park: Denali National Park and Preserve

Key Points:

• On January 20, 2025, President Donald J. Trump signed executive order <u>Restoring Names That Honor American Greatness</u> (90 FR 8629) that included direction for to rename Mount McKinley.

 On January 24, 2025, the Department of the Interior (DOI) announced that the U.S. Board on Geographic Names, under the purview of DOI, is working expeditiously to update the official federal nomenclature in the Geographic Names Information System to reflect these changes, effective immediately for federal use (Interior Department Advances Restoration of Historic Names Honoring American Greatness).

Background:

- In 1917, Congress established Mount McKinley National Park and named North America's highest peak as Mount McKinley.
- The Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act of 1980 renamed the park to Denali National Park and Preserve (Denali).
- In 2015, Secretary of the Interior Sally Jewel, endorsed by President Barack Obama, issued a Secretarial Order that officially changed the mountain's name from Mount McKinley to Denali.

Current Status:

- Denali staff is preparing a plan to implement the name change.
- Changes will be implemented on facilities, wayfinding signs within the park, on displays inside of visitor centers, kiosks, publications, films, programming, and other messaging.
- NPS is kicking off the effort by changing the name online with existing Denali staff. Approximately 1200 pages and 250 documents are being reviewed and edited.
- Some print material replacements cannot be produced in time for the 2025 summer season, and staff will continue to distribute those materials with the Denali name.
- Denali staff is preparing talking points to respond to questions from visitors.
- Based on the duration of the 2015 name change effort, completion of this plan will take 4-5 years.
- An early cost estimate of \$90,000 includes:
 - o The production, fabrication, and shipping of maps, exhibits and waysides.
 - o Labor costs for reviewing and editing publications, installing exhibits, etc.

Park Guides and Quinn,

With so many newly minted web authors (hooray!), I'd like to ask for your help making name change updates online. Updating the website is one of our highest priorities for the name change because of how visible and far-reaching it is.

In short, there are about 480 webpages that need to be reviewed (excluding old news releases, blog posts, etc. that we don't need to retroactively update). I've divided the list into chunks of 50 pages per person so that folks aren't overlapping work with each other.

Some pages will be quick reads with no edits needed, while others will require more time, but on average I'm hoping it won't take more than 5–10 minutes per page. There's no hard deadline on this, but any progress you can make during your prep time is appreciated. Check with your supervisor if you have questions about prioritizing prep time and projects.

For each page, please:

- 1. Read the page, looking for any instances of Denali that refer to the mountain and not the park. If edits are needed, publish them.
 - In addition to the main text on each page, don't forget to also check things like photo captions and "content promos" (the four square images with text and links that are in the footer of some pages). You do *not* need to review any PDFs or other files that may be linked on your pages. (I'll be working through uploaded files separately, but webpages are the first priority to address.) Interactive maps will also be addressed separately. If there are any images, such as static maps, on the page with Denali labeled, please make a note in the spreadsheet so we can return to those later.
- 2. In the <u>Webpage Inventory for Name Change.xlsx</u> spreadsheet, initial the first column to mark that you've read and reviewed the page, and then mark Yes or N/A in the second column to indicate whether or not any edits needed to be made, along with any other notes if needed.

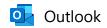





2025 Funding Changes for the Unigrid Brochure Program – In 2023 Associate Director for IEV, Tom Medema, sent a Field Memo about changes in the cost-sharing model for printed copies of Unigrid brochures. Due to the ongoing decline in available funding for printing and shipping, HFC will require parks to pay for printing and shipping costs for all copies of Unigrid brochures beginning in FY2025.

Hi Trevor.

As you may have heard, there was an executive order issued last week that says in Section 3 part (b):

Within 30 days of the date of this order, the Secretary of the Interior shall, consistent with 43 U.S.C. 364 through 364f, reinstate the name "Mount McKinley." The Secretary shall subsequently update the Geographic Names Information System (GNIS) to reflect the renaming and reinstatement of Mount McKinley. The national park area surrounding Mount McKinley shall retain the name Denali National Park and Preserve.

We know that DENA will need to make a Unigrid order this spring to have enough copies for the summer. I know edits typically take months--how likely is it that the mountain name would be able to be updated for the publication to hand out this summer? If not this summer, what is the estimated time for the edit?

Right now, we are just trying to gather information to come up with a plan either way.



All:

Today I talked to Vern Carlson from Cantwell. Vern used to be on the Denali Subsistence Resource Commission, Vern has participated in some of our govt to govt meetings. I called him because I'm trying to set up a meeting between him and Cody and Brooke. We got to talking about the name of Denali and he mentioned that Denali is the Koyukon name for the mountain but in fact there are four other similar names/pronunciations for the mountain. After talking with Vern, I thought it would be cool, if possible, our interp/education/CR/subsistence team develop a panel for the DVC devoted to the 5 Athabaskan perspectives of the mountain that would include the 5 Native Names for the mountain - below are the five names that Vern passed on to me from the book, Shem Pete's Alaska. The third column is how to pronounce the name; however, not all the letters are correct because of the English font. Then I thought maybe we could include photos of the various vantage points of the mountain from Nikolai, Minchumina, Cantwell, the park, and Talkeetna (along with the appropriate native name/pronunciation). We could complete the panel with the Legend of Denali as told by the late first Chief of Nenana Mitch Demientieff --see below link to the legend (this kiosk/recording is located at the Eielson Visitor Center). This panel could serve an important message to visitors about the strong connection that AK Native people have to the mountain. Maybe there could be a mention to how it got named McKinley. It seems like this topic has now become of national interest and as a park it seems important for us to provide the Indigenous perspectives on the name of the mountain out of respect to the local tribes as well as to educate our visitors.





Additional answers for these kinds of questions:

What's the process for renaming a foreign name or international name like the Gulf of Mexico? Is it solely under the jurisdiction of the BGN and/or can a name change be made through an act of Congress or an executive action?

The <u>Principles</u>, <u>Policies</u>, <u>and Procedures</u> says that "A name proposal for a feature that crosses the international boundary with Canada or Mexico is likely to require additional processing time because the BGN must coordinate such proposals with the appropriate foreign names authority." But this is <u>not a proposal to the BGN</u>, but a statement by the President-Elect that he would change the name.

Once a name change is made by the BGN how is it applied? What changes?

BGN would not make the change if done by Executive action or Congress. GNIS would be updated and other federal data sources that use GNIS would be updated on their own refresh cycles.

Are BGN appointees serving at the discretion of the head of each agency/the president? Are they appointed by the head of each agency/the president?

The <u>BGN bylaws</u> Article II Section 2 states "The Board is comprised of principal members and deputy members. The head of each department and agency represented on the Board shall appoint one principal member and also may designate one or more deputy members."

Good morning,

My apologies for the delay - Federal offices in the US were closed yesterday as a day of mourning for former President Carter.

There are a few things I'd like to mention from the perspective of the US BGN.

1 - My home agency (USGS) has provided guidance that BGN staff (including me) are not to respond at this time to media inquiries. As you might guess, we have received a few questions from high-profile media outlets. But, we are currently not providing a response of any kind.

- 2 The process by which the name would be changed in the US depends on the type of action taken to make the renaming official. Of course, by far the most common method to name or rename a geographic feature is a proposal to the BGN, and allow the deliberative process to run its course. However, The BGN Policy on Names Considered or Established by Congress or the President notes that "Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress or Executive order are legally official, and therefore, are not bound by BGN principles, policies, and procedures." This includes name changes. For any names established by an act of Congress or Executive order (or proclamation), the name is entered into/changed in GNIS once official. Federal data sources are updated from GNIS on their own data refresh cycles.
- 3 As of this morning, there is draft legislation to rename the Gulf of Mexico offered in the US House of Representatives (HR 256). I have attached the text which has been released (I believe on social media) by the sponsor, Rep. Taylor-Greene. If this were to pass into law the name would become official. The BGN would not be involved in the decision-making process and our authoritative database (GNIS) would be updated to reflect the new official name. The draft bill also dictates a schedule for update of Federal mapping products.
- 4 As others have stated, I am also unable to offer any additional information on how other national naming authorities would recognize this name change.

Should the US President proceed without following a proper consultative process through the USBGN, Mexico and/or the IHO, then the international community would likely continue using Gulf of Mexico.

While both databases include the Gulf of Mexico, it is limited to Louisiana in the GNIS, whereas the GNS categorizes it as an international body of water. This distinction does/could delineate a different course of action for the way the name(s) are reflected in the GNS, specifically if this gets into 'disputed territory' issues. Clarifying this distinction in advance may help prevent future issues or questions.

Good morning,

My apologies for the delay - Federal offices in the US were closed yesterday as a day of mourning for former President Carter.

There are a few things I'd like to mention from the perspective of the US BGN.

1 - My home agency (USGS) has provided guidance that BGN staff (including me) are not to respond at this time to media inquiries. As you might guess, we have

received a few questions from high-profile media outlets. But, we are currently not providing a response of any kind.

- 2 The process by which the name would be changed in the US depends on the type of action taken to make the renaming official. Of course, by far the most common method to name or rename a geographic feature is a proposal to the BGN, and allow the deliberative process to run its course. However, The BGN Policy on Names Considered or Established by Congress or the President notes that "Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress or Executive order are legally official, and therefore, are not bound by BGN principles, policies, and procedures." This includes name changes. For any names established by an act of Congress or Executive order (or proclamation), the name is entered into/changed in GNIS once official. Federal data sources are updated from GNIS on their own data refresh cycles.
- 3 As of this morning, there is draft legislation to rename the Gulf of Mexico offered in the US House of Representatives (HR 256). I have attached the text which has been released (I believe on social media) by the sponsor, Rep. Taylor-Greene. If this were to pass into law the name would become official. The BGN would not be involved in the decision-making process and our authoritative database (GNIS) would be updated to reflect the new official name. The draft bill also dictates a schedule for update of Federal mapping products.
- 4 As others have stated, I am also unable to offer any additional information on how other national naming authorities would recognize this name change.


Congressional Bill H.R. 276 Status

I. KEY POINTS

The BGN, conjointly with the Secretary of the Interior, is directed to establish and maintain uniform geographic name usage throughout the Federal Government, including solving name discrepancies, approving new names, validating and recording existing names, and promulgating all official names.

The BGN comprises representatives of Federal agencies concerned with geographic information, population, ecology, and management of public lands.

The U.S. Board on Geographic Names follows a set of principles, policies, and procedures approved by the Secretary of the Interior with reference to both domestic and foreign geographic names; and to decide the standard names, orthographies, applications, and their promulgation for official use.

The Geographic Names Information System (GNIS) was established and is maintained by the U.S. Geological Survey in cooperation with the U.S. Board on Geographic Names. It represents the Federal Government's only official repository for identifying official placenames. Its purpose is to have a single efficient source of official placenames for use by all federal agencies so they don't need to maintain their own data sources.

II. OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

The BGN is integral in strengthening and maintaining Tribal relations and developing collaborative opportunities that preserve the history and diverse cultures of Tribes. These activities include Tribal consultation, pronunciation of Tribal geographic names for the public, engaging and requesting input on geographic naming proposals, and attending Tribal Historic Preservation Officer meetings.

The BGN offers the public a way to participate in the Federal geographic naming process. With respect to the Domestic Naming Committee, there are currently no limitations on who can participate in proposing new names, and name changes in the U.S.; something that can be both an opportunity, and a challenge and will require additional considerations as policies and procedures are updated. However, the Foreign Names Committee follows much stricter guidelines.

With the accessibility to the BGN via the internet comes greater visibility to a larger audience. Recently, the BGN has been involved with many high-profile cases that has increased the number of media inquiries, Congressional requests, and Freedom of Information Act requests, and inquiries from the public. With minimal staff and greater visibility, the ability to maintain operational tempo has been degraded.

The current design of GNIS does not meet the needs of agencies for a single efficient source of official placenames, requiring agencies to maintain their own data sources.

In addition to GNIS, the Geographic Names Server (GNS) is the central database for foreign geographic names approved for use on Federal products.

The BGN DNC mission is funded through Congressional appropriations allocated to the USGS, which is primarily used maintain GNIS. The annual appropriation is roughly \$900K; this funding supports the Executive Secretary of the Domestic Names Committee, 2 Federal staff, 1 contracted staff, and multiple technical personnel who maintain the GNIS database. Board members are not funded for their service to the BGN.

III. BACKGROUND

The U.S. Board on Geographic Names (BGN) is a Federal body created in 1890 and established in its present form by Public Law in 1947 to maintain uniform geographic name usage throughout the Federal Government.

By law, the BGN is responsible for promulgating all geographic names except those applying to offices or establishments of Federal agencies (Pub. L. 80–242, sec. 1 and 7; 43 U.S.C. 364 and 364f).

Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress, Executive order, Treaty, or Federal proclamation are official by law. This does not apply to geographic names used incidentally in the language of documents intended for other purposes.

If not named by an act of Congress or Executive order, federal land units are named by the administering agency under the authority of an act of Congress.

All proposals are evaluated in cooperation with State geographic names authorities and advisors; Federal, State, and Tribal agencies; local governments; other authoritative bodies; and the public. BGN policies, published usage, and State, Tribal, and local governmental needs, will also be taken into consideration.



I write about the proposal of President Donald J. Trump to rename the Gulf of Mexico to the American Sea and to return the name of Mount Denali to Mount McKinley. I urge the members of the Board of Geographic Names to respect their decisions in naming these geographic features.

On August 30, 2015, Sally Jewell announced that the mountain would be renamed Denali, under authority of federal law which permits her as Secretary of the Interior to name geographic features if the Board on Geographic Names does not act within a "reasonable" period of time.

The International Hydrographic Organization — of which both the United States and Mexico are members — works to ensure all the world's seas, oceans and navigable waters are surveyed and charted uniformly, and also names some of them. Dear Members of the U.S. Board on Geographic Names:

I am writing to express my opposition to the presidential directive to rename the "Gulf of Mexico" to the "Gulf of America" on several grounds:

- 1. Cost. The cost of reprinting operational mapping products that include place names (e.g. operational navigation charts) will be prohibitive and will come out of budgets that would otherwise be used for more pressing matters.
- 2. Conflicting mapping standards. There is little likelihood that countries bordering the Gulf of Mexico will change its name as well. This will create unnecessary differences and confusion between maps produced by different countries. This could cause miscommunication urgent situations such as search and rescue and extreme weather warnings.
- 3. Contentious Symbolism. The new name creates an enduring public symbol of cultural and policy differences between the U.S. and the other countries bordering the Gulf, much like the difference between the "Persian Gulf" and the "Arabian Gulf." In a time of greatly increasing international tensions we do not need additional artifacts that can be used to mobilize conflict.

I'd like to share the communications guidance that the BGN staff has been given by USGS and ask that you please share this with your standing committees and advisory committees (DNC, FNC, ACAN, ACUF).

USGS has received multiple media inquiries regarding the process associated with renaming a feature via executive or congressional action (e.g., executive order, act of congress). We have been instructed not to respond - at all - to media inquiries about this topic at this time. That guidance may change in the future, but that is our current direction.

Should any members of the BGN committees receive media inquiries, I would encourage them to follow the same guidance if they are able.

For internal reference, I am sure you are all aware that the <u>Policy on Names Considered or Established by Congress or the President</u> notes that "Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress or Executive order are legally official, and therefore, are not bound by BGN principles, policies, and procedures." This includes name changes. For any names established by an act of Congress or Executive order (or proclamation), the name is entered into/changed in GNIS once official. Federal data sources are updated from GNIS on their own data refresh cycles.

Attached is a draft Secretary's Order to implement the Executive Order "Restoring Names That Honor American Greatness". This draft was developed collaboratively by the USGS and the Solicitor's office, with input from key BGN officials including the BGN State Dept. representative. A few notes:

- 1. Sec. 2 of the EO calls for agency review of all agency BGN appointees. The USGS has sent forward through DTS a memo to the Secretary's office in support of the DOI membership review. Therefore, this draft does not include any additional guidance for implementation of that request. However, additional instruction can be added if the department feels it appropriate.
- 2. Sec. 4c of the draft corresponds to EO sec. 2d, but this is a situation that we don't anticipate will arise.
- 3. Sec. 4d of the draft corresponds to EO sec. 5. This section of the draft is less detailed because it is not a BGN or USGS function and will need some additional DOI decision-making over who should implement and in what timeframe. (E.g. I'll posit that it might be a responsibility for DOI's Office of Intergovernmental and External Affairs, and note that the need to prepare announcements in time for July 4, 2026, will be time-constraining on that process.)

This draft aims to help DOI address all relevant sections of the EO, but we can edit/adjust based on

your feedback.

I just asked the USGS folks who support the Board on Geographic Names to confirm that we don't need a fully populated and sitting BGN to implement name changes initiated by EO/SO. I just got this confirmation back:

The BGN plays essentially no part when the name change is the result of an EO or SO. The BGN does not need to approve the name, because it has already been

approved by someone with the authority.

As a side note, our folks are anxious to get the BGN populated as the Board fields a lot of changes requested by the public. But that process can continue in parallel with the EO-directed changes.
